All you didn't want to know

I had a call last night from Ed, NT9V – and after al long chat he said he is no longer on the air because all the guys in his Radio Club are old goats and cant climb and all the new KA9 types are "Shack on the belt" guys who don't help out others... Very typical of the new bread of "Clueless or Codeless hams". Listen to a local repeater and you hear traffic reports and weather reports but nothing about ham radio... Their loss...

But what can be done to get Ed back on the air. We talked and I asked him why not hook up the mobile antenna at home? HUH? He says... I said to hook it up with a few radials under it and it should work fine. RS sells mirror mounts that I use all the time.. PL259 on one end and screw in the antenna on top... it is on a 90* elbow mount.

That got me thinking of some of our members who have moved into condo's or retirement homes (like my parents and Roger) that don't allow outside antenna's. Well my dad is a die hard CB'er and put his mag mount antenna on the grill outside and wondered why it didn't work out too good... he could hear, but nobody heard him.

Well, after playing around I helped him erect a squirrel feeder. It was a platform about 8 foot above the ground. It must have had an automatic de-icer on it because it had wires running into the house underground and out four directions from it was slits in the ground also about 8 foot long. To those who think I lost my mind... We erected a quarter wave ground plane with a wooden platform feeder on top of it.... Worked out great till he passed away – and a side benefit – he enjoyed watching those tree rats eat...

I have mounted hustler antennas on rail fences (with and without PVC covering it). I have mounted them on iron and wood railings of balconies (wood ones need counterpoise). All have worked much better than being QRT. Most work fine, and if you keep them away from the house or other vertical stuff higher than them...

A very thin wire thrown over tree's and fed on one end with the other end either flapping in the wind or an insulator... feed it through a tuner and your on the air. Hell, even a dipole (or end to end Hustlers) in the attic work... I have stapled wire to a tree and made a multi band vertical for a KA2 buddy of mine who's dad didn't want any of those ugly antennas in his yard.

Anything you try is better than nothing... and that beats getting on the internet anyday... nothing good there anyway... except the MARAC web site.

WG6X Ray, "Now What?"

After getting a ride over for the luncheon at the 3M with Larry, NA7W, in his Toyola Tundra, I was impressed with how quiet his Toyola Tundra was along with how he felt about his Tundra. I knew it was getting to the point recently when the old mileage rowed over 180 thousands on the old Chev pickup it was either rebuild the old baby or replace it. I remembered how nice Larry's Tundra seemed and how quiet his Icom 706 sounded in it, so after an arm and a leg along with some wheeling and dealing I had me a new 2003 Tundra in my driveway. Then it kinda hit me, Now What!

I made up a mickey mouse antenna setup (a 20 meter hamstick on a trunk mount leaning out the back off the tailgate) to test the new baby and the 706 showed about 3-5 S units of engine noise with or without the noise blanker. I sent Larry a e-mail asking about what he did to solve the engine noise on his Tundra and he replied with some wheres and hows of what he had done. Now knowing I had a little knowledge along with some past experiences of the problem and suggestions to solve it, it was time to get started. Gee, less then 300 miles and here I am drill in hand. Luckly to solved the engine noise on the new truck only required me to drill one hole in the hood for mounting a ground strap from the hood to the truck engine firewall along with three other ground straps using holes or bolts that were already there. Then set up my mickey mouse test and no engine noise. Boy, that was easy!

Now was the time to think about installing antenna's. After kicking around many thoughts and all, it seemly came down to a bumper mount, a ball mount, or add something on the top of the bed for mounting antenna/s. I gave it some more thought and then had a toolbox mounted in the bed of the new truck which gave me an area to mount antennas. I installed a L bracket on the back of the toolbox and yepper no engine noise with a good antenna installation.

Then I got sick with a nasty head and chest cold which laid me up a little over three weeks. While laying in bed for hours and hours trying to get over that cold, I got thinking do I really want to hang a couple mounts for the hamsticks (the toolbox would not support my bugcatcher) and take them on and off or whatever. I got a e-mail from Dave, W4YDY, concerning his Tarheel screwdriver and his web and Tarheel sites. I went to the Tarheel web site and looked at the pictures of antenna

installations and there was one installed on a Tundra. I sent the off a e-mail to KC4DP and he just raved about the antenna and the Amac antenna controller he was using on the Tarheel screwdriver that moved the antenna to frequency without using an SWR meter or whatever, just put the frequency into the 706, the controller, or use the 706 memories to move the antenna. Now that would make senses as trying to adjust a screwdriver type antenna while driving didn't turn me on one bit.

I ordered the model 200A 4 foot, 12 volt motor Tarheel antenna and the Amac controller from Tarheel Antennas. After several days of thinking where to mount the screwdriver, I when with KG4DP idea of inside the bed back by the tailgate on the left side. Of course I had just recently had a spray-in bed liner which required me to sand down the area to mount the antenna. I then removing the tail light assy, to put on the nuts for the bolts and drilling five holes for the mount and mounting the antenna mount. Gee, another five holes drilled into my new truck and less then 400 miles on it.. Then a couple of days of thinking about where and how to run the antenna control cable and the coax to the cab. I slightly enlarged a hole by the stake hole for the PL-259 to clear and then ran the antenna control cable and the coax into and out the front side of the rear stake hole down and across the top of the wheel well to the back of the cab of the truck which had a hole already there with a plug. Talking about being radio friendly truck it even had holes with plugs on the back of the cab on both sides.

Now the last of the big questions, where to put the antenna control box, where to mount the antenna controller, and lastly how was I going to mount the 706. I had already made up a CW keyer mount off one of the cup holer per a suggestion from Larry. So I added a housing on top of the CW keyer and mounted a cellphone mount(that took a day of trying a range of cellphone mounts to find one that would work for me) for the antenna controller which put the antenna/rig controller up high. I ordered a front floor mat for the truck and had a section cut out in the center for the old Radio Shack hump mount that I had the 706 mounted on. That took care of the 706 part and now the only major thing left was where to put the antenna control box. I remembered that the Tundra had two storage areas under the back seats, so since I was coming into the cab right next to the one for the truck jack

Gator is out door and into his truck and as he goes out of the driveway, He yells, remember what the cardiologist said, if it tastes good, spit it out." I give Gator the high sign and go back into the radio shack. The birds screech Gator is gone; Gator is gone. Hector had a pup. I forgot to ask Gator if he is going to drive for me in the April Florida QSO party. I make a post it and put it by the radio. I wonder who is running on the CW net. I tune to 14.056.6 KHz. Getting sleepy, time for a nap.

Now What? (Continued)

I used that one to store the antenna controller. That required a hole for grounding for the antenna control box, so out came the drill again. That left just routing the coax and the CAT 5E cable from the antenna control box to the controller and the small cable from the controller to the 706.

Gee, only had to drill seven holes and enlarge one hole in the new truck everthing was mounted and ready for the antenna calibration. I drove a couple blocks from the house to a large parking area and started calibrating the screwdriver(16 inputs).

After a few false starts due to not looking at what I was hitting on the controller the antenna was calibrated for 80-10 meters with under 1.4 on all bands. Now I thought lets try using the rig and controller together.... Bad news in all my rough housing or shippping damage keys 4,5,& 6 on the key pad didn't work. Still inputs from the rig to the controller and the antenna tune. So everything is working, except the keys.

So the next day I shipped the controller unit back to Bill KG4CPO the owner of Amac and a one day turn around its on the way back to me. Now that great customer service.

Got the old Chev pickup sold in one day after spending a couple days of removing wiring and cleaning.

"Now where are those maps and when can I hit the road?"
