FROM THE DESK OF THE SECRETARY

The responses from all of you concerning the changes that we have made to the publication of the RoadRunner and my Secretarial duties have been very encouraging. There are just a couple of things items I would like to mention that would help me perform my job more efficiently.

First I would like to ask you to keep your Email addresses current in our data base. There are over four hundred of you that have chosen to receive the Road Runner by Email. The program that Gene (KD9ZP) developed makes it possible for me to Email your copy of the RoadRunner. There is a problem, however, when I receive some forty to fifty error messages indicating that the message I sent has been returned because there is no such account with the ISP or there is no such ISP or domain name. Another problem that is beginning to surface is that some of your ISPs reject the RoadRunner attachment because it is viewed as a virus or just plain junk mail. This is especially prevalent with those of you who use the ARRL reflector. I have attempted to keep track of all this and as you will see this month that I have changed many of you back to receiving your RoadRunner by snail mail. I do the best I can with the Virus situation, I use the current Norton Anti Virus definitions and I scan my computer every day. I can’t do anything about your ISP’s parameters. You must reset both your ISP’s and Anti Virus’ parameters to accept the RoadRunner attachment – PLEASE!!! I thought that by using a PDF format that the ISP would accept the attachment, but I am still encountering too many returns.

I wrote this note to let all you know that if any of you are not receiving your RoadRunner via Email, as you as you requested, these are some of the reasons. If some of you are still not receiving the RoadRunner in any form - please let me know. Our Newsletter Editor, Roger (W2NWL), does a “bang-up” job and he has the current issue ready for delivery the first week of the month. By the way, Roger is always looking for interesting articles so please keep sending them to him.

One other minor request - any correspondence that you send to me, either Email or snail mail, please include your CALL SIGN. Your call sign is the primary key that I use when I do searches for renewals, updates and changes.

I enjoy being your Secretary. Working with Jim, Bill, Bob, Gene, Roger and the rest of the Board of Directors is a real kick. I appreciate the notes and comments that you send me and enjoy talking to you on the air or on the telephone. If there is anything I can do to help, please contact me.

I hope I will see you all at the 2004 MARAC National in Weslaco, TX this July. It sure looks like the Committee is working to make it a memorable event.
