KwikLog 2005 Update

Apparently there is some misunderstanding, misconceptions, and a general lack of knowledge about the new KwikLog 2005. The intent of this article is to provide a better understanding of what KwikLog 2005 is, what it does, how it compares to the original or current KwikLog, and when it will be available.

What It Is:

Like the original, KwikLog 2005 is a logging program designed specifically for county hunters. As you all are aware, Willis, KJ4EJ, has done an outstanding job developing and maintaining the original program for many years, and it has served us all very well. Several years ago, he decided that it was too big a job to maintain and he made an agreement with MARAC such that MARAC would develop a new program. Apparently there is now some controversy over that agreement, but that is beyond the scope of this article. Design and development of the new program was started about a year and a half ago. Gene, KD9ZP and I began coding at that time, and shortly thereafter Tom, NJ2DX, joined us. The basic features of KwikLog 2005 are virtually the same as the original, but many of the screens and their operation are different. Gene has made presentations at the last two national

KwikLog 2005 is written in Visual Basic 6.0 and its database uses Access 2000. The database contains the same information that the current KwikLog has, but using it should prove to be easier and faster because of the features of Access 2000. The database will be provided to all users as part of the program package and it is not necessary for a user to have Access 2000 installed. Conversion routines have been developed to convert data from both the current KwikLog and other logging programs that use the ADIF format.

What It Does:

The primary function, of course, is to log QSOs and track the progress made toward the various awards. Logging a contact with KwikLog 2005 is simple, but the logging screen is significantly different from the current KwikLog's logging screen. QSOs are saved in a user's personal database that is part of the Access 2000 database. Other features include displaying a current total count for all awards that are being tracked, editing of log entries, printing MRCs, and a "Needs" list for any award that shows the counties needed for all the states or for a specific state. This list can be displayed, printed or written to a file.

How in Compares:

Virtually all of the features of the current KwikLog have been or will be incorporated into KwikLog 2005. The underlying difference is our use of the Access 2000 database system. Those of you who have seen Gene's presentations have undoubtedly noticed the visual differences between the two programs. Although operation of KwikLog 2005 differs from the current KwikLog in many respects, the basic functionality has been preserved.

When:

As of this writing (September 8, 2004), we are on track for a first release on January 1, 2005. Some features, such as the map routine, may not be available for the first release, but will be included in a subsequent release we will provide periodic "How To" articles to answer any questions that arise.

Interested In Testing?

We're always looking for help testing the program, so send me an e-mail (<u>k7dm@casco.net</u>) if you're interested in. The hours are long and the pay is terrible, but you might have fun anyway.

He showed up at one of our local club meeting in Roanoke, Virginia and as the routine goes, we all introduce ourselves by name and call. This young fellow gave his call N4XE and name Willie, and since he was new to most of us at the meeting, he was ask to give a little information about his ham interest. So Willie began by first saying he had been licensed in 1958 and that he enjoyed most everything thing about ham radio in general. He built most of the equipment used during his early years. He then proceeded to give of some of his former calls (K8MIH and WA4RDV) and he was USA-CA holder #37, issued August 22, 1970 and Charter member MARAC # C-12. Since I've been County Hunting for about 10 years or so, this was of great interest. I talked with Willie after the meeting and few times on the telephone and on 10 meters in recent days. I ask him how long it took him to work USA-CA, "Willie said, "about two years." I was interested in the band or bands and he told me that he used mostly 75 meter and some 20 meter. What is that about Dude?" "Gator we discussed how many of the CW county hunters are now working counties on 30 meters. Bob is requesting MARAC to have an award for 30 meters." "I see no problem with the request. All an applicant has to do is request a 30-meter endorsement.
