Awards Information By Phil Yasson AB7RW Awards Committee

There have been many changes made to the MARAC Awards program since the last National Convention in Weslaco, TX. At the general membership meeting, the members voted to have names assigned to the awards rather than names unrelated to the meaning of the award such as LC-1, LC-2, etc. Since then, the awards committee has been very busy. As of this writing, many awards have been polished up and completed.

This is where I entered the picture. I thought it would be a good idea to highlight one or two awards each month while the committee forges ahead to completion. The awards are posted on the Internet at http://marac.org/awards.pdf. One of the reasons I asked to do this is because I find many County Hunters are only working on one award at a time, namely the CQ-CA when you could be working on multiple awards at the same time.

As I progress through the awards descriptions, you will see that the bookkeeping can be very tough, unless you use one of the CH software programs. Before you purchase a program, read the instructions carefully to make sure it is the software you really want. The MARAC software writers have been busy writing a new program. The issue date has not been established yet. It will definitely keep track of all the information required to apply for any MARAC Award.

A lot of the awards are old hat for many County Hunters so look at this as a review. For those of us still at the beginners level, I hope everyone will all gain a bit of new knowledge of how the awards program works.

The first award to work for is the USA-County Award (CQ-CA) sponsored by CQ Magazine. This award may be earned in increments of 500 counties, or hold back until all 3077 counties are worked. Each county requires a QSL confirmation. This is accomplished by sending your QSL card and an SASE to the station you worked. When his/her card is received, that county is then confirmed forever. Counties may also be confirmed on an MRC card. You can list multiple QSO's on a single MRC card. The MRC cards are mailed the same way as a QSL card, or sent to one of the County Hunter QSL Bureaus.

Regardless of what method you use, a SASE is required. The QSL Bureaus and MRC card printers are listed on the web pages for which the addresses follow. http://www.countyhunter.com/chars.htm, http://www.countyhunter.com/chars.htm, http://www.countyhunter.com/cji-bin/flynn/services.pl.

The CQ Magazine Custodian requires you to obtain a Record Book to use with your county awards application. These books are obtained from CQ at a cost of \$2.50 each. The data required in the Record Book is the callsign of the station worked, the band and the mode. In the back of the book is an application for you to fill out and sign, and a certification form to be filled out and signed by two General Class or higher amateurs who testify that they have checked and verified your QSL receipt for each county. The custodian reserves the right to ask you to produce certain confirmations for his own satisfaction.

Send the completed book and \$4.00, if you are a CQ Magazine subscriber or \$10.00 if you are not, to K1BV Ted Melinosky, 65 Glebe Road, Spoford, NH 03462-4411. The Record Book will not be returned to you so make sure you keep a second copy for yourself. You may submit a computer printout from one of the county hunter software programs in lieu of the Record Book. Always check the web for the latest information before you submit your entry, in case there were last minute rule changes.

When Ted issues your USA-CA number, it is entered into the MARAC records where it remains forever.

Then you are on to additional awards like BINGO and others. (Continued on Page 2)

DATELINE CW By Ed, KN4Y

Patience is the best remedy for every county hunter.
