## 2005 (39TH) MARAC COUNTY HUNTERS CW CONTEST 0000Z Saturday May 7 to 2400Z Sunday May 8, 2005

The Mobile Amateur Radio Awards Club is pleased to sponsor the 38th Annual County hunters CW Contest. Mobile and Fixed operation from every county in the U.S. is encouraged.

<u>RULES:</u> Fixed Stations may be worked only once on each band. U.S. Mobiles (identified by signing /M) may be worked each time they change county or band. A Fixed Station working a Mobile on a county line may count the Mobile as only ONE QSO (15pts) and may count each county (two maximum) as a separate multiplier. Only stations with one operator (one transmitter at a time) are eligible for awards.

Note: PORTABLE CATEGORY has been eliminated due to lack of participation.

**Clarifications:** 

- Please use the state/county abbreviation list available at URL: http://www.bnk.com/W0QE/--CountyAbbrev-V3-4col.pdf (or .doc). Contest contacts between operators in the same vehicle or in shadowing vehicles are invalid. Does not apply to casual contacts between passing mobiles.

- There are no restrictions against spotting mobiles.

- To be considered as "Mobile" you must put out a least 2 counties.

**EXCHANGE:** Signal report, state and county-abbrev for U. S. stations. Signal report, "DX" for all other stations (including Canada & Mexico).

SCORING: For a valid contact, one station must be in a U.S County. One point for Fixed stations; 15 points for U.S. Mobiles; 5 points for DX. Controlled Net contacts are invalid for contest purposes. FINAL SCORE = TOTAL QSO POINTS times TOTAL NUMBER OF U.S. COUNTIES WORKED.

Mobiles changing states during the contest should calculate their scores for each state and a total score. Total Overall Score must not count a county as a multiplier more than once regardless of the mobile's county or band.

<u>FREQUENCIES</u>: CW: 3.575, 7.050, 14.050, 21.050, 28.050. Fixed Stations should operate above the suggested frequencies; mobiles, below.

**AWARDS: MARAC Contest Certificates:** 

First Place Fixed in each State, Canadian Province, and Country.

First Place Mobile in each State.

**MARAC Contest Plaques:** 

1st and 2nd place U.S Mobile, 1st and 2nd place U.S. Fixed station, 1st place Canadian Station if enough entries warrant an award, and 1st place DX station. For contest Award purposes, DX is any country other than the U.S. and Canada.
