Dateline CW March 2006 Ed, KN4Y

Time is the rider that breaks young county hunters.

S ince retirement I find time confusing for an old county hunter like me. While preparing my last months article for the newsletter I thought the next month last month was this month. I am probably sorry for any confusion this may have caused. To keep me straight I am adding the month of the article under the title. I was going to blame Jerry but I was afraid he would push arctic air this way. I dismissed it as PSM (prolonged senior moment). March is that time of the year when county hunters have discarded their Christmas trees, emerge from winter hibernation and become radio-active.

Speaking of radio-active check out the county hunters CW net on 3556.5 KHz. The net is currently being run on Tuesday nights. This may change depending on the results of a survey taken on the county hunters forum. There have been many reported pile-ups, a delight to hear. Make a note and join the fun. The number of mobiles running on 80-meters is also increasing during some State QSO parties. Get an 80-meter resonator and join the fun.

Speaking of fun with a challenge start now planning for the MARAC CW contest on May 6 and 7. The contest coordinator is Randy, AA8R who has done a great job of putting the contest together. The details are available from the MARAC web site at, <u>http://marac.org/MARAC_CW_Contest_2005.htm</u>.

I hear Gator down shifting as he comes off the main road. I check the pantry and cooler, and all is in order. I hear the familiar, rat-a-tat-tat and yell, "Come in Gator, what brings you this way?" "I was wondering how you did in the ARRL DX CW contest." "I did great, I actually made several DX contacts on all the bands." Gator, as usual is not paying attention, he is looking at the computer screen. "I see you are planning for the MARAC CW contest." Gator is reading the contest rules, "Where be that new Mixed award category you mentioned?" "It is a brand new award and the rules will probably be updated on the web site before the contest." "What be Mixed, Brokeback contacts?" Sometimes it is best to ignore Gator. I point to the cooler.

Gator opens the cooler and hands me a cool one, "I see something else that Randy may want to change." "What is that Gator?" "The 80-meter frequency for the contest is listed as 3575 KHz. The CW county hunters are using 3556.5 KHz for that new CW net." "You are correct Gator." I hate to admit Gator has a good point, but even a stopped clock is correct twice a day. "Randy will probably change the frequency to 3550 KHz to be consistent with the other up 50 from the band edge: Randy is a great believer in KISS." "WHAT?" "I though you knew that means Keep it Simple Stupid."

Gator shakes his head and gets a bag of onion flavored pork skins and two more cool ones. He opens the bag and we crunch a few skins. Gator asks, "What is this Mixed award?" How to Log at 60+mph Ron. AA4S

Vehicle: 1993 four-wheel drive Chevy S-10 Blazer Equipment:

- 1. ICOM IC-706MKIIG on homemade mount in front of center console
- 2. Vibroplex key paddle mounted on top of the IC-706 within easy arms reach (I taught myself to key right-handed even though I write left-handed)

3. Alpha-Delta 4-position antenna switch mounted on a board which is supported on, and well-secured between, the top of the passenger door armrest and on top of the center console.

4. Olympus VN-1000 Digital Voice Recorder (Radio Shack #141143) also secured the aforementioned board within easy reach.

a. A remote microphone is mounted on top of, and secured to, the IC-706 just above its internal speaker and is connected to the Digital Voice Recorder.

b. Depending on your situation, it may be necessary to use snap-on type rf chokes such as the Archer # 273-104 sold at Radio Shack on the remote microphone cord.

5. *Heil HS-706 boom mic/headset which is factory wired in such a way that it does not deactivate the IC-706 internal speaker when plugged into the mic jack. This allows me to record both sides of the QSO. The PTT button has a clip which I attaché to my seat belt.

*Bob Heil told me I am the only one in the entire world who appreciated the way this unit was wired. Everyone else complained about it, hi! In my case I don't have any passengers to disturb. His newer "Traveler" does quiet the internal speaker on the IC-706 but I believe it can be modified to work the way the HS-706 does by cutting one of the leads.

My system is fairly elaborate and is dedicated to running QSO parties in North Carolina and West Virginia while running as many as 15 counties making 600-700 QS

Os in 10 hours, ~80% on CW. For more casual operation, just the recorder placed in a convenient location with the microphone set-up should be sufficient.

An alternate system would be to use a recorder such as a Radio Shack #CTR-100 AC/Battery cassette tape recorder with remote microphone. I have used this system in the past with the disadvantages that tapes have to be changed frequently and you have to be careful to use them in the proper order. In addition, I had to say the time and Band into the recorder periodically when on CW in order to be able to submit an acceptable log.

In any case I don't recommend logging by writing or typing while driving; this endeavor is dangerous enough as is! Another thing is that I usually either have a detailed planned route with me or run the route ahead of time (with a GPS) to minimize the chance of making a wrong turn.

Antennas:

40m Hamstick on front license plate mount

20m SSB/CW Hamstick on 3-magnet roof-mount

15m or 80m Hamstick on 3-magnet roof mount

10m magmount on roof

40m SSB Hamstick on rear license plate mount

All Hamsticks have tuning coils

Other stuff:

Spare car battery, EverStart Marine battery (for running a second IC-706), battery charger, 100 foot-long extension cord, air pump, jumper cables, a gollon of water, snacks, pillow, blanket, and an empty water bottle (I'll let you imagine what that is for!)
