**Dateline CW**

Ed, KN4Y

No person ever became a CW county hunter all at once.

(Continued from a previous time continuum)

“I hear him Gator. Give Mark a call.” Gator logs a 599 and with a Piscataquis county Maine contact on three bands I have firmly completed fourth time around all CW and now for the paper work. A job is not done until the paper work is completed.

Gator yawns, “Now what, Dude? Too early to celebrate.” I grab the ten cup coffee pot and top off our half empty or half full mugs; one marked with my call sign and one with GATOR. I sit back to enjoy the moment. A person can only get fourth time around once. “Well Gator, it is time to get the paper work into MARAC.” “That figures, more trees to be cut down.” “No Gator, this is all done on the internet and the email system.”

I take a long slow sip of Java. Addiction is underrated. I go to the computer, “Okay Gator here is what we do.” Gator pulls up a chair to observe. Gator has already entered the last contact in the MARAC logger. I go to PRINT, click on BOOK, next click on fourth time and fill out the fields on the screen. Next, I tell the program to write my log to a file. The log is in text format and put into my Logger Data folder.

Next, I go to the MARAC web site and click on awards, next I click on Worked All Counties Application. I note the complimentary dart board. I fill out all the requested information, attach my fourth time log, and send the information to Janet Camron, KC5QCB, the MARAC Awards Manager and dart board entrepreneur. Gator is not impressed and heads out the door. “See you later I have an appointment in thirty minutes.” He smokes some rubber and before you can recite the American’s Creed he is on the by-way.

(A day or so passes)

I get a call from Janet, the MARAC awards manager, my application is approved and I have fourth time around number 132. I now go to the last stage of the paperwork. I return to the MARAC web site and this time click on Last County Application. I fill out the information and off it goes to Janet. Next I write a check and mail it to her and now the paper work is complete. I think Mark, KO1U, who gave me my last county did not want a plaque. I could not locate the e-mail and sent him a plaque in case I read the writing wrong.

I read on the forum Terry, WQ7A, has updated the MARAC database and I can start logging for fifth time around. Great, this is just in time for the Texas QSO Party. Gator and I work the contest, I work the stations and he keeps our body nutritional and electrolyte systems in balance. A county hunter, seasoned and new, should work as many state QSO parties as possible. This is a quick way to get a bunch of counties in a short time period especially if you work both CW and sideband. Take this Texas QSO party for example, I used only CW and worked 116 counties for fifth time around or 45 percent of Texas in 13 hours. Texas has plenty of CW mobile operators running in different counties and that helps. Norm, W3DYA, gave me 14 contacts and band conditions were not the best. Plus, in the evening there was a digital contest on 40-meters. Wonder what the totals could have been under the best of conditions.

The next chance to get counties is the California QSO Party. This is, next to Florida, one of the biggest radio active State weekends of the year. I was only able to operate 4.5 hours and still worked 45 counties, most on 15-meters CW. You can see the butt advantage of working a bunch of counties in a short time. If you work both CW and sideband there is a good chance you can work all the counties in the state during the designated time period.

(Return next month for more information for new (and seasoned) county hunters)

Until then work the CW Sweepstakes, then go global and work the CQ CW World-wide DX Contest. Are you interested in the MARAC Top Band award? Work the ARRL 160-meter contest, which requires some extra steps to be discussed later. The lone State activity is the KY QSO Party. Work the KY party and send me your total counties worked and how many were needed counties. Gator will post the results. Send to edkn4y@embarqmail.com.

Anatomy of Logger

Through the years as a Ham Radio operator, many of us have changed our call for one reason or another. If you kept track of County Hunters thru the use of a spreadsheet, and you are like me, and a Novice to spreadsheets, the first thing you would do, would be to add a column called **Previous Call #1** to track a CH'er call change.

This is an easy way to track a call change till the CH'er makes another call change. Now you have to add another column called **Previous Call #2**. Sooner or later, you run out of room and the spreadsheet no longer fits on a piece of paper – even using landscape mode.

Here is where a database like **Access** is far superior to tracking CR'ers over a spreadsheet.

To track call changes in **Access**, simply create another table called **Calls - Previous**. It would have two fields:

**Call ID**

**Old Call**

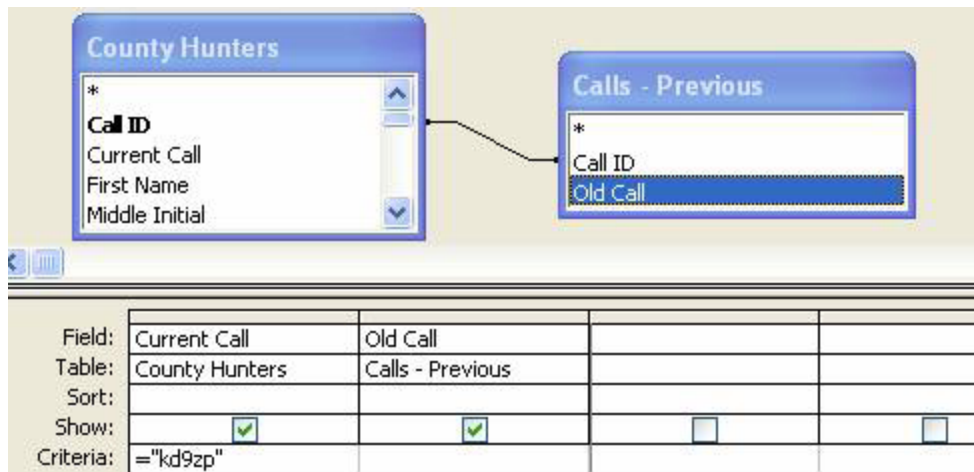
Here is what **my (KD9ZP)** old calls looks like:

Calls - Previous	
Call ID	Old Call
3473	K9BOE
3473	KN9BOE
3473	N9FUD

Now the trick is how to extract the list of my old calls given my **Current Call (KD9ZP)**.

To due this, we need to create a **Query**.

In **Access**, we simply select **Queries** and create a new **Query** as follows:



Notice I loaded the two tables:

**County Hunters**

**Calls – Previous**

The line between the two is called a **'join'** and it links the **Call ID** between the two. Notice also, that the **'Criteria'** is **="kd9zp"**, since I wanted to know **my** previous calls.

The picture above is the 'design mode' and when executed, you would get the following:

Query1	
Current Call	Old Call
KD9ZP	K9BOE
KD9ZP	KN9BOE
KD9ZP	N9FUD

**Logger** however, does not use **Access's** queries directly, but uses code to duplicate the **Access Query**. Here is what that code would look like:

```
SQL = "SELECT [County Hunters].[Current Call], [Calls - Previous].[Old Call] "  
SQL = SQL & "FROM [County Hunters] "  
SQL = SQL & "INNER JOIN [Calls - Previous] ON [County Hunters].[Call ID] = [Calls - Previous].[Call ID] "  
SQL = SQL & "WHERE ((([County Hunters].[Current Call])='kd9zp'))"  
lngRecordCount = OpenRecordset (rsPreviousCalls, SQL)
```

(Notice that I break the **SQL** statement into 4 lines to make more readable. Each line is 'concatenated' with the previous line by using the '&').

The 'OpenRecordset' statement would return a **lngRecordCount** of 3 (for **KD9ZP**).

As you can see, the use of a **table** to track **Previous Calls** allows almost unlimited call changes.

In closing, I hope this gives you some insight into the power of databases.

Next month, with a **County Hunter** table of over **6500** calls, how does **Logger** (and **Access**) find the call so quickly??
