Dateline CW

Ed, KN4Y

A CW mobile county hunter is someone who can help you with your coloring book.

The weather outside is the force keeping me inside the radio shack, I am not a fan of cold weather, I am a fan of a fan in hot weather. So here I sit broken hearted waiting for the new sun spot cycle to get started. I am listening to the CW net and all is quiet. The high cost of gas combined with flaky band conditions has reduced mobile flow to a trickle. This would be a good time to work on my MARAC Logger logs.

When I imported my Kwiklog logs to the new MARAC Logger I noticed I had a few import problems. I had 60 bad dates, 8,000 bad times and 6,000 bad frequencies although the band designations are correct. I had 260 new calls. I also had 600 bad contacts when I was a mobile station. I had logged a lot of DX calls as a fixed and mobile station and they were a problem when imported. Now the healing begins.

But first I must confess I have help as I undertake this dangerous mission. My main logger Guru is Terry, WQ7A, who refers me to Tim, KD5CXO for unusually stupid questions. Once in awhile I actually find a bug and the two work with Gene, KD9ZP, to make the corrections. There is also Randy, AA8R, who I have not bothered yet. This team makes the logger log. A bug, for me is the time I forgot and logged 5NN for the RST. The logger went bananas and cussed me out. I do not know what was said as I do not understand binary. The computer team made some changes and now 5NN is logged as 599. Now all CW county hunters can log RST as received. Please send no money.

I begin by bringing up all logs in a state using the view/edit facility. I highlight the QSO's that have no time and make the correction by adding a time. These are old logs so the times are no longer relevant. When the logs are imported all the mobiles are designated as fixed. I highlight the logs and change fixed to mobile as required. Next I highlight each QSO by frequency and make the necessary change. I get ready to bring up another state when I hear Gator's four-by-four barking down the driveway. I get up and check the cooler.

I yell, "Come in out of the cold." Gator comes in carrying a fruitcake in a red round metal container, "I got this cake for Christmas and figure it would go good with a cool one." Gator's instincts are not always the best, but I nod in agreement. "What you doing?" "I am converting from Kwiklog, the first logger for county hunters, to the new MARAC Logger for county hunting logging." "You know Dennis, KK7X wrote about the MARAC Logger in Ham Radio." "Did you read it?" "No, did you?" "No, if you want to help, be quiet and watch and learn or at least watch."

Gator gets two cool ones and cuts two slices off the fruit cake. I yell, "Do you need a hammer and chisel, some dynamite?" "No, this chain saw works great." "Remember when we were wondering if any county hunter got a last county for the WBOW during a contest." "Yep." "I got an e-mail from Jim, N9JF who got a last county for the WBOW during the Georgia State QSO party." Gator hands me a cool one and a gigantic slice of fruit cake, "Thanks." I think the only object denser than a fruitcake is a black hole. We sit listening to the radio and the quiet CW net. "Are we going to be mobile in the GaQP this year?" "God willing and the creeks don't rise." Gator gives me the high sign.

I hear CW and look at the radio. Why I do that I do not know, it is not a TV. I realize it is Gator's cell phone."Got to run Dude, got a problem with the reflux on the second stage splitter, How is it that we put a man on the moon before we figured out it would be a good idea to put wheels on a bowling ball bag?" If you plan on joining this contest mobile, please post your trip on K3IMC so that others will know where you are going. Remember any contacts made in our contest are valid for USA_CA, MARAC Awards, and for the other contests that will be held on this weekend.

European County Hunters

 \mathbf{F} rom the 28th of August to the 16th of October, 2007, I had the opportunity to travel in Europe. The primary purpose of the trip was to visit old friends, see new places in Europe, and attend the RSGB HF Convention.

Although I didn't take any radio equipment with me, I did manage to operate in ten countries using friends' equipment or through pre-arranged local contacts with individual or club stations. I managed to make over 3600 contacts from the various locales and several of the county hunting fraternity made contact.

My first stop was with a well-known county hunter and DXer - Rudi, HB9RG. Many of you have met Rudy and Rosmy at the various national MARAC conventions and/or mini-conventions over the years. I had the pleasure of staying with them in 1998 on another trip to Europe. Rudi has a fantastic location for radio about 15 miles south of Zurich. He has earned many awards to include DXCC Honor Roll # 1, 5BWAZ, 5BWAS, 9BDXCC, etc. He has also been quite active county hunting in Switzerland, Canada, and mobile in the United States. He was awarded USA-CA # 791 on December 22, 1992. He is currently working on his 7th time around! Here is a picture of Rudi with some of his awards:



My second stop was in Broni, Italy, to visit my good friend Tony, I2PJA. I first visited Tony along with Angelo, I2PHN, in 1986. Some of the older county hunters should recognize both calls. Angelo was awarded USA-CA #659 on April 24, 1990. Sadly, he is now a Silent Key. Tony continues to chase DX (Honor Roll #1) and has about 50 counties to finish. I hope that we will be seeing him on the nets once conditions improve. Here is a picture of Tony at his station:




After stops in Monaco; Nice, France; and Dresden, Germany, Fmet one of the Cw county nunters for the first time - Gerd, DL5AWI. He lives near Eisenach and is quite active chasing counties. He does not have a station — at home at this time and has to drive about 20 miles to a station location that he and some friends have set up in the countryside - primarily for contesting. He has 2541 counties confirmed on CW and 2814 confirmed mixed — mode. Here is Gerd with some of his awards:



I continued on my trip through Denmark and Norway before seeing some other old county hunting friends in Sweden - Lars, SM5CAK, and Rolf, SM4BNZ. I had visited both in 1985. Rolf chased counties for many years and was awarded USA-CA#777 on August 11, 1992. He is still very active on the bands chasing other interests. Here is his picture:



Lars continues to chase only fixed stations for USA-CA! I was amazed to learn that he has confirmed 2918 counties with only fixed stations! He has worked two more (Ohio, KY and Jerome, ID) but has been unable to get a confirmation. Again, some of the older county hunters will remember Lars operating mobile in the United States back in 1982 and 1992. Here is a picture of Lars at his station:



On to Stockholm, the Aland Islands, and Helsinki - and my first meeting with another CW county hunter - Henry, OH3JF, in Riihimaki. He is getting very close to finishing USA-CA with 3032 confirmed (2998 from mobiles and 34 from fixed stations). He is also an avid DXer with all countries worked along with many DX awards. From Finland I flew to London and attended the RSGB HF Convention near Cambridge. Unfortunately, I didn't see any county hunters there.
