County Hunter of the Year - SSB

#### WQ7A Nominated SSB by: Gene -- KD9ZP

Terry has been a licensed 'ham' since 1959 eventually becoming an extra class licensee. Though not a county hunter until 2001 he had already worked approximately 1000 counties. Then subsequently he discovered 14.336 and the rest is history. The challenge of working all 3077 counties began. A mere two years after seriously chasing counties Terry finished and earned USA-CA 1075 in September 2003. On September 9th 2004 he was awarded 'Bingo' #256 in September 2004 and that was followed by a second 'star' in February 2005.

During this time WQ7A has transmitted from over 1000 counties on his way to and from 'mini's' and national conventions, accompanied by his wife, Boni. Both have become 'fixtures' at these gatherings adding their vitality to the events. Terry is ever willing to help as Assistant Net Control and help with relays on the net. He served as a member of the MARAC Awards committee for several years. At many of the conventions he has attended he has given informative and detailed presentations about the use of Street Atlas USA.

In addition Terry has written two Excel spreadsheets to help those county hunters using Kwiklog to view their files and correct the errors before importing into Logger. He personally takes time to work with each new Logger user to help with the errors that come from either Kwiklog or an ADIF import. Terry mails out all of the CDs to new Logger users and has developed an on-line download method, replacing the need to send out the CD. He works with me on a daily basis resolving Logger problems and suggests new features for Logger.

In 2006, Terry was nominated and elected as the MARAC Treasurer.

#### N4UJK Nominated SSB by: Ray -- WG6X

For over sixteen years Ed Bunch, N4UJK, has been active on county hunting both mobile and base. He has put out thousands of counties both as a team with KC4UG and on his own. He has not received County Hunter of the Year, but he deserves this award both for past mobile operations and his present and ongoing contributions to county hunting.

Ed got his CQ "USA-CA award number 878 in August, 1992, and is a long-standing member of MARAC. Last year Ed earned the MARAC Master Gold award after a couple years of reconstructing logs that were damaged when a lightning strike took out his computer, as well as his radio and antenna equipment. He has also earned the MARAC 5 STAR, Worked All Counties (for the 8th time!), Bingo IV, and USA-PA-K. Ed has given 26 county hunters their Last County for the Whole Ball of Wax along with hundreds of state last counties.

During a 3M convention in 1996 Ed met the late Ken Carpenter, KC4UG, and they became close friends. Together they became one of the most active county hunting teams until the passing of Ken, KC4UG. Ed normally was the driver for the team while they put out counties. Ed earned the nickname "Magellan" for his navigational skills and county hunters benefited from the numerous extra counties the team put out while wandering off the planned path. After some medical problems and hitting a deer during a county hunting trip, Ed hasn't been able to be an active mobile for the past few years, but has plans to replace his old Buick with over 200K miles and he hopes soon that he will be back on the road putting out counties. In 2002, after retiring from his career as a high school print shop teacher, Ed got into supplying the printed needs for county hunters. Many have or are using his famous Pink Cadillac coloring book to track counties or his other logs and Mrc's. For his many years of service to County, Ed Bunch, N4UJK, should be the next recipient of the MARAC SSB County Hunter of the Year.

#### N4AAT Nominated SSB by: Carol -- AB2LS

When voting for county hunter of the year you should consider Scottie, N4AAT formerly N7AKT as a very worthy candidate for the award.

He began county hunting in 1977 in Alaska, purely by chance. He was 'hooked'. He began running the net with WA6MAR and once he learned net control operations, he began to run the net while mobile. To quote Scottie "I got really good at running the net with one hand on the mike, one hand writing down calls and one knee steering the car!" His call changed from WD9GPC to N7AKT when he moved to Las Vegas. He spent a whole lot of his time running counties and as net control. Attending conventions he made lots of friends through the years and continues to do so.After a move to South Carolina he changed his call to N4AAT. Since becoming a county hunter Scottie has transmitted from all 3077 counties, finishing that feat in 2006.

Finally, God willing, Scottie intends to try to transmit for all 3077 counties a second time. **A TRUE COUNTY HUNTER** and well deserving of the award.

### Nominations for County Hunter of the Year – CW

#### N9QS Nominated CW by: Cliff - AC0B

Roy got started in County Hunting in late 1979 when he put out a couple of counties in Missouri as K0OQI (later KC0JG). He found that operating in the net environment fit into his schedule perfectly and once he started thinking about Mrc's and Record Books, he became hooked on County Hunting. Over the years he had the feeling that his CW was slipping away and at the encouragement of several CW County Hunters at the Hampton VA convention, he decided that he would try CW. Roy relates "they told me that no matter how slow I was or how badly I sent CW that the folks on the net would help me, and that I wasn't to get discouraged". He made his first attempt at putting out counties on CW on his return from Virginia that year. Roy says that "with my brain locked and my palms sweating I tried it and managed to put a county out – what an ordeal". But he persisted and with the help of several Net Control Stations, he soon began to copy a little better and feel a little more relaxed broadcasting on CW. In 2001 he met Jerry W0GXQ in Arizona and the two of them put out a County Line on CW. "That was good experience and at that time and in the months to follow, Arden AAOIP as net control was very patient with me". Soon Roy's confidence began to grow and he put out many more counties on CW. Now and then when he was operating at home he helped out with relays and sometimes would act as Net Control. Over the years he has worked all counties on CW, earning USACA CW #91. He enjoys CW so much that he is going to stick with it. He doesn't know how many counties that he has transmitted on CW but there have been quite a few. Roy has many stories about his CW ventures, so when you see him at the next MARAC convention, ask him about them. In October 2007 Roy changed his call sign to N9QS because it sounded better on CW and the phonetics fit with his nickname (guessing Quick Silver??). In the past year Roy has contributed to the county hunting community by running many counties and acting as CW Net Control station. His technical abilities regarding mobile installations are evident by his strong signal. Roy has always supported the MARAC awards program and attendance at numerous conventions. His "Last Counties" transmitted now total nearly 650. A contact with N9QS will result in credits for many of MARAC sponsored awards. This gentleman deserves your vote for CW County Hunter of the Year.

#### KL1V Nominated CW by: Robert - KC6AWX

Kent was first licensed in 1976 and then upgraded to Extra Class in 1980. He worked a little at County hunting but mostly DX, IOTA Islands, and contests until 1997. It was at that time he stumbled across the County Hunter Net on 14.336 and has been there ever since.

Kent completed USACA 1st Time (#1015) on 01/25/2001, 2nd Time (#364) on 08/06/2006, and Bingo (#272) on 07/21/2005.

Kent is a proficient mobile operator, on both SSB and CW, and is able to hear the weakest of stations. He has helped on the net when needed as both Net Control and Assistant Net Control. He has transmitted from well over 1000 counties on both SSB and CW. He has always planned trips around fellow County Hunters needs and has made innumerable "side trips" to help folks fulfill their needs. He has amassed, through August of 2007, 456 Last Counties and 11 WBOW awards.

Kent has been a member of MARAC since 1997 and has always been actively involved in the Club. He is currently on the Awards Committee of MARAC

#### NM2L Nominated CW by: Ed – K8ZZ & AB7RW

I have worked Greg many times on CW over the years while he was mobile. Greg has also been a GREAT Net Control operator and assistant Net Control on the CW frequency.
