Dateline CW Ed, KN4Y

No place affords a more striking conviction of the vanity of a county hunter hopes, than a rare county line.

This is the ARRL year of the State QSO party. Being of sound mind I still operated CW as a Rover in the Georgia QSO party. The bands were great considering the lack of sun spots but there were plenty of W6RK spots. Gator is checking my 80-meter contacts against my county needs. Saturday I had a driver and Sunday I drove by myself stopping and running the county. Saturday the stations were calling during the entire time in the county, no lag time between counties. Sunday being Easter there seemed to be a core of stations that were worked in each county. I never got around to using the 160-meter antenna.

Gator gets up and gets two cool ones. "You made 141 contacts on 80-meters and worked 9 new counties, a natural bingo and one for fifth time around. I see you did not work that Texan dude Norm, W3DYA. I will get the rest of the log later. How was the Sunday trip?" I wet my whistle before I continue. "Saturday as you know was uneventful, great weather, no flooded back roads and decent band conditions. Sunday I was alone and would stop in a county and run on 20 and 40-meters until no stations answered me. After three calls I drove to the next county. By the way, the red clay makes mobile to mobile contact in Georgia very difficult because of its RF absorption to twenty-feet." Gator's response is digital.

I pretend not to notice him and continued. "I stopped in Arlington at a strip mall that was closed for Easter. I pulled into the parking lot and started running Early county. I was working three stations per minute when a local deputy dude came up to the window and asked for identification. We talked for a few minutes and it seems I had set off the alarms in the stores. I told him about amateur radio and he responded that he thought there no longer were amateur radio operators. When he was convinced I was not a thief robbing a store while sitting in my van I moved on. I stopped at a catfish pond but 20-meters had gotten noisy." Gator is laughing hilariously; it was my turn for a digital response.

Saturday I traveled 476 miles, ran 16 counties and made 604 QSO's. Sunday I traveled 295 miles, ran 8 counties and made 259 QSO's. I notice as I get older I get butt fatigue so Monday I plan on a visit to the butt spa. Gator hands me a cool one, "Did you work the Ontario QSO party when you were at the bowling tournament in Pasco County?" "Yes, in between shifts I put the antenna on and worked VE3GSI and VE3MGY the only stations I heard on 40-meters" "How about the Michigan QSO party?" "I heard a few stations but they could not hear me. It was a washout."

Gator's attention span is shorter than a wavelength and he picks up a sheet of paper, "Well, the Michigan QSO party may have been a washout and I read where the MARAC national convention is to be in Petrononewkey, Michigan." "That is pronounced Petoskey and comes from an Ottawa Indian Chief, Chief Pet-O-Sega. It is also the name of a stone that is a rock and a fossil composed of a fossil-ized coral, Hexagonaria percarinata. The town is located in Emmet County and is home to the historic Gaslight Shopping District." "Do you mean R....?" "Gator, behave yourself." But I have to laugh at the thought. Gator is grinning from ear to ear as he heads to the cooler.
