Dateline CW

Gator sez it be true and I do think. There are five reasons a county hunter should drink. Good beer and a friendly South East Mini, Or any other reason why.

We are discussing the Colorado QSO party. Gator points to the log, "that is not many QSO's for that many hours." I shrug my shoulders, "You never know until the fat lady sings and band conditions were not great and being on CW the activity was slow to crawl." "I see where that Texas Dude N4CD was running mobile, did you work him?" "Yes, I worked Bob a few times when I could hear him; there was not much mobile activity that I heard. The RTTY contest put a damper on working stations on 40-meters, but after that RTTY contest ended the band was great. But I heard no new stations. I heard nothing on 80-meters." Gator hands me a Imported Italian Espresso "Did you get any new Colorado counties?" "No, nothing, not even a new call combo, but Colorado gets run a lot by the county hunters. We enjoy our Imported Italian Espresso.

"I must say that idea you had to hang an picture of an Opossum on the Yagi was great. Paper LC


Last month I talked about how the "Email" Last County applications are processed. This month I will describe how the "Paper" Last County applications are processed and then what activities occur after all LC applications have been inserted into the Awards database.

Each month anywhere from half dozen to several dozen paper LC applications arrive via US mail. These paper applications have to be entered manually into the Awards database, which is one of several functions within the Awards Program (see Fig. 1). For each paper application, the appropriate data is typed into a data entry screen. After entering the data, a click on the "Post Award" button causes the data to be inserted into the Awards database.

There are several drawbacks to the manual data entry process:

- 1. Each LC application takes at least a minute (or more) to handle, whereas the electronic applications only take a few microseconds:
- 2. There is a greater chance of typing/data entry errors;
- 3. The account balance does not get sent back to the County Hunter (applicant).

So, once all of the LC applications are in the Awards database, what's next? **BACKUPS!** (using an external device).

After the backup process is finished it's time to print – Last County certificates, Roadrunner certificates, address labels, and packing slips. Following that comes 3 to 4 hours of assembling paper, stuffing and sealing envelopes, and determining postage and applying postage. The next day everything is taken to the local post office and, if Uncle Sam doesn't go broke, you'll receive your Last County Certificates and Seals within a few days.

But, I'm not done yet. The plaques still have to be ordered. The Awards database, via a reporting feature, can generate the orders for the different plaques or plaque plates. See Fig. 2. A PDF file is created from each of the "Plaque Order" reports and emailed to the appropriate trophy shop. Then, another backup is taken.


The plaque orders arrive in about 3 to 4 weeks, which triggers another assembly process. The plates are attached to the "Car" plaques and each plaque is then wrapped in padded bubble wrap and put into either a padded envelope or a postal box. Then, another trip to the local Post Office for postage and mailing.

So, from the time the LC applications are processed, which is typically the last few days of each month, it takes about 3 to 4 weeks before the plaques are actually mailed out.

I've only scratched to surface of Awards processing, but this should give you a better understand of what it takes to be awarded a Last County certificate or plaque.

Gene, KD9ZP, is the author of the Awards program and, from my 30 years as a programmer/analyst, I can safely say Gene has done an outstanding job of developing this application with a high degree of data integrity.
