

- 8. Participate as a fixed station if cannot go mobile, almost priceless.
- 9. Depending on propagation, the State counties can be worked on several bands.
- 10. Learn the various exchanges used in QSO parties; good preparation for contesting.
- 11. Use whatever operating mode you enjoy.
- 12. A good State QSO party requires a U in the sum of the participants.

We look at the list, what did we forget? I am sure some county hunter will tell us. We sit admiring our endeavor and finishing the Latte. I point out to Gator that contests are also a good source for getting MARAC award contacts. I show him my sweepstakes contest log and point out I made 22 contacts for Bingo III, a Natural Bingo and three new call combo's, and nine new counties on 80-meters. The counties will have to be verified using e-mail or a QSL card. A county verification is not necessary with contacts in a State QSO party. The latte is gone, the cup discarded. It is times like this when an espresso machine is a good investment.

We hear CW from Gator's back pocket; he answers his cell phone,"Got to go Dude, the underground drug cartel wants to do a TV interview of my H1N1 elixir." It was about 150 years ago that Richard King, the salty steamboat captain developed the world's largest ranch of nearly one million acres here in the Lower Rio Grande Valley. The King Ranch is larger than the state of Rhode Island. This National Historic Landmark is considered to be the birthplace of the American ranching industry. This is where the Santa Gertrudis breed of cattle was developed, as well as the first registered American Quarter Horse. Besides the ranch operations, you'll visit the Henrietta Memorial Museum and it's rich collection of artifacts, browse the Sellers Market near the Old Opera House where saddles, blankets and those famous King Ranch purses are sold, plus much more. You'll be treated to a Texas Style Bar-B-Que at the Ceasar Kleberg camp house for the midday meal.
