Just a friendly reminder ... if you plan on doing any Spring cleaning in your radio shack, please remember me before you elect to throw anything away! Contributions to MARAC History have been somewhat slim thus far. My postal address and Email are good in this newsletter, in the MARAC database, and on QRZ. Please send some old goodies!

Roadrunner newsletters from the mid-90's often included a monthly column by Steve, WN7J called "25 Years Ago" which chronicled MARAC activities from the early 70's. For example, in the October 1995 Roadrunner, Steve wrote about MARAC happenings for October 1970 ... highlights of which are discussed below.

An October 1970 club meeting was held at the home of Clyde, W0YLN (later W5TQE and now a Silent Key) and attended by five members.

For the first six months of operation, the club showed income of \$917.50 and expenses of \$681.66. Non-profit tax-exempt forms were in the process of being completed.

Plans for the 1971 ICHN convention in Kansas City were being finalized, including an announcement that the first-place door prize would be a Tempo 1 transceiver and power supply.

The newest USA-CA numbers (#40 thru #44) were announced ... and the newest MARAC membership numbers (up to #R-133) were announced.

It was decided to proceed with ideas for a 3,079 Last County award. Feedback from the membership was requested on an award for the Last County in a State, including whether this should be for last county worked or last county confirmed.
