KANSAS PSK ROUND-ROBIN TRIP

On Sunday morning the 26th of December, 2010 Sharon and I started out on a 5 day trip that took us through 7 counties in Colorado and 37 counties in Kansas. Our primary goal was to try and put out as many of these counties as we could on 20M, 30M, and 40M PSK-31 as an OM/YL team. Our secondary goal was to put out as many of these counties as we could on 20M and 40M SSB plus satisfy some special requests for CW.

The results of the trip were both a little surprising and very satisfying. We had a great time and hopefully made a bunch of folks happy. Between the two of us, we made a grand total of 2228 contacts of which 1176 were PSK-31, 969 were SSB, and 83 were CW.

The way we found that worked best was to stop on county lines to put out PSK-31 on 30M, 20M, and 40M (usually in that order) and then put counties out on the fly using SSB. On our PSK-31 runs, we used macros (slightly modified for team use) originally designed by Lloyd (NX4W). After using these for 3 days I shortened them up some which almost doubled our contact rate. Let's face it – using PSK-31 is a lot slower than using SSB. There were some county lines where it took almost an hour to work everyone who wanted to work us. One of these was the county line of Rice and McPherson, KS where we worked 26 stations (giving out 104 contacts) on 30M, 20M, and 40M!

The total number of people active on PSK-31 was also surprising. Over the course of 5 days, we worked a total of 35 different call signs on just PSK-31. Granted, some of these were "passers-by" who happened to stumble on the frequency, but they were welcome and quickly adapted to our very short procedures. Sharon even got a new county (for her 2nd time) from one of them! Naturally we had a lot of repeat calls as we went from band to band on the same county line (collecting "County Challenge" band contacts?). The top ten callers on PSK-31 and their total number of contacts (include times 2 for county line & times 2 for both our calls) were:

- 1) N4JT (Paul) 180
- 2) K8QWY (Ed) 134
- 3) AA8R (Randy) 96
- 4) WB2ABD (Paul) 88
- 5) N5MLP(Ron) 70
- 6) WA7JHQ (Sterling 64
- 7) N8CU (John) 56
- 8) WA4UNS (Doug) 50
- 9) NN9K (Pete) 48
- 10) NU4C (Paul) 36

There were many others (too many to list here) who worked us to make up the 1178 total contacts made.

We even experienced our first "pile-ups" on PSK-31. We discovered that 2 or more PSK-31 stations (calling on the same frequency) usually print only "garbage"! If one of the competing station transmits longer that the rest, they will suddenly start printing clearly. This is sort of "tail – ending" for PSK! There doesn't seem to be any capture effect like on FM where the strongest station wins. On PSK-31 stronger stations just produce stronger garbage if someone else is transmitting at the same time and on the same frequency. There doesn't seem to be any benefit to asking calling stations to "spread out" time-wise. If we tried that, usually ALL calling stations would delay their call and still end up on top of one another producing garbage! I believe the answer may be to use the same technique that DX stations use, i.e. listen up or down slightly from our transmitting frequency (which is locked) and have calling stations call slightly higher or lower than our transmitting frequency. Because PSK-31

only requires about 20 Hz offset from another signal to become readable, competing signals would occupy only a few hundred Hz of spectrum at most. The main problems with this approach are that calling stations would have to call a little longer to allow the receiving station time to tune them in. Also, everyone has to learn how to lock their own transmitting frequency and listen at an offset point. It's really not hard, but can be confusing to newbies.

Fortunately, weather was not a problem on this trip. Also, we got a chance to try out our new 8-band "Flying Saucer" antenna designed by Barry (W9UCW). It worked very well with one exception. Since I didn't have it "tethered", it had a tendency to lay back when we were driving at highway speeds which changed the tuning, especially for 30M and 40M. Our linear is very sensitive to SWR and self protects if the SWR gets much higher than 2:1 or so. The end result was that we had to retune (even using the same band & frequency) every time we changed from highway speed to stopping on county lines (or visa versa). I would have cured this on the road, but had no fishing line with me. All-in-all, a minor inconvenience, however.

Looking back on the

trip, I believe that our principal problems were slow contact rates and lack of other mobiles using PSK-31. There are technical ways to help cure the first problem, but getting more folk out on the road putting out counties on PSK-31 is a matter of motivation. Having been there, I know that operating PSK-31 mobile can be intimidating to the uninitiated, but it is like anything else – if you really want to try it, one just has to take the plunge and try. There are plenty of people around to help out if you need it. Maybe PSK-31 is not your "cup of tea". If that is the case, there are plenty of other aspects of Ham Radio for you to enjoy. But, if operating PSK-31 mobile sounds interesting to you, we challenge you to give it a try. If the results of our trip are any indication, it looks like PSK-31 is rapidly growing in popularity among county hunters as well as the rest of the ham community. Why not give it a shot??Matt & Sharon

The Special Meeting of the MARAC Board of Directors was called to order at 0100Z by the President (Joyce-WB9NUL).

A motion was made by Terry (WQ7A) and seconded by Leo (WY7LL) to accept the minutes of the December 1, 2010 meeting. The minutes were accepted by a vote of 6 in favor and none opposed.

A motion was made by Jim (KZ2P) and seconded by Bob (KC6AWX) to accept the Treasurer's Reports for November 2010 and December 2010. The reports were approved by a vote of 5 in favor, 1 abstention and none opposed.

A motion was made by Jim (KZ2P) and seconded by Terry (WQ7A) to accept the Awards Manager's Financial Reports for October 2010, November 2010 and December 2010. The reports were approved by a vote of 5 in favor, 1 abstention and none opposed.

A motion was made by Terry (WQ7A) and seconded by Cliff (AC0B) to appoint Barry Mitchell (N0KV) as MARAC South Central Director. Barry shall serve until the next annual election of directors (July 2011), at which time the position will be filled for the remainder of the unexpired term. The motion was approved by a vote of 6 in favor and none opposed.

A motion was made by Jim (KZ2P) and seconded by Leo (WY7LL) to accept the below clarification of the Mobile Diamon Award. The motion was approved by a vote of 6 in favor and 1 abstention. Proposed Clarification of the Mobile Diamond Award Rule:

Mobile Diamond Award

OBJECTIVE: To make **Valid Contacts** in **All USA Counties** with mobile operators who have earned the MARAC Master Platinum Award, including contacts while in a **Mobile Operation** and transmitting from at least 500 counties on at least two different bands after the applicant has earned the Master Platinum Award.

SPECIAL RULES: All **Valid Contacts** for this award must have been made on or after September 15,

2010.

After the date of the applicant's Master Platinum Award, the applicant must make contacts with holders of the Master Platinum Award in All USA Counties (Master Platinum contacts). Both Master Platinum operators involved in the contact may count both counties toward the Mobile Diamond Award.

After the date of the applicant's Master Platinum Award, the applicant must make additional Valid Contacts while transmitting in a Mobile Operation from at least five hundred (500) different counties.

In each of the 500 different transmitted counties, the applicant must use at least (2) different **Bands** and make at least three (3) **Valid Contacts** with different stations on each Band.

In each of the 500 different transmitted counties, at least one (1) of the Valid Contacts must be with another holder of the Master Platinum Award. The contact may be on either of the two bands.

For each Valid Contact, the two Master Platinum Award holders must be in separate counties (or countries) at the time the Valid Contact is made.

AWARD LEVELS: The Mobile Diamond is awarded for making Master Platinum contacts in All USA Counties and making multiple contacts while transmitting in a Mobile **Operation** from at least 500 different counties on at least two **Bands** as a Master Platinum holder.

APPLICATION AND FEES: Standard application and logs. There are no fees for MARAC members for this award. Standard fees apply to non-members.

The Awards Chairman - Bob (KC6AWX) - asked the Board guidance on implementing the below new awards approval process. All of the Directors agreed with Bob's proposal.

The new awards that have been proposed by our members are very complicated. The LOGGER Team has experienced much difficulty programming the various new awards (most recently the Mobile Diamond Award). Because of the programming problems, the Awards Manager proposes amending the awards approval process:

- 1) The new award is submitted to the Awards Manager.
- 2) The Awards Manager submits the new award to the Awards Committee.
- 3) After the Awards Committee approves the award, it is submitted to the LOGGER Team for their input on the viability of programming the LOGGER program to accommodate it.
- 4) After the new award is approved by the Awards Committee and the LOGGER Team it is submitted to the Board of Directors.

A motion was made by Jim (KZ2P) and seconded by Terry (WQ7A) to adjourn the meeting at 0127Z. The motion was approved by a vote of 7 in favor and none opposed.


