The 2011 U. S Counties QSO Party will be held this year on July 30 and 31. Some new details as compared to previous MARAC contests:

There is no longer a separate contest for SSB and CW, the two are combined. Categories have been set up for those who choose to operate CW only, and SSB only, as well as those who wish to operate mixed mode.

The contest now runs in two time slots, as compared to a straight 48 hour run. The first time slot is 1200Z July 30th, until 0600Z July 31st. The second time slot is 1200Z July 31 to 2359Z July 31.

There also have been some changes to the scoring system, as well as the mixed category. the mixed category is for those who wish to operate form both their fixed location, and form their mobile. All details can be easily found at www.marac.org/cwrules.htm .

For the first time, individuals and/or clubs may sponsor the plaques awarded in the contest. If you or your club or group is interested in sponsoring one of the remaining plaques, or even have an idea for a new contest award, please contact the contest coordinator, KA3QLF via email or a phone call. Both can be found in the MARAC County Hunters Database.

Barry was elected by the MARAC Board of Directors to temporarily fill Ross's (N0ZA) position on the board after Ross became a silent key.

Barry is an ARRL life member, DXCC Honor Roll member, ARRL DXCC/WAS/VUCC card checker, occasional contester, and occasional DXpedition operator. He is a director of the Colorado Repeater Association and is a member of the Mile High DX association. He is also an active wilderness search and rescue volunteer, a state search and rescue coordinator, and a Comm Unit Leader for the Douglas County (CO) Incident Management Team (IMT).

I have not received any nominations for the positions of Great Lakes Director or North Central Director (both 3 year terms). Both positions will remain open for nominations for another 30 days. Any current member of MARAC is eligible to run for office. For the District Director positions you must live in a State within that District - they are listed on the MARAC website.

Nominations are now in order for the 2011 CW and SSB County Hunter of the Year. Nominations must be received by your District Director not later than the end of March and should contain a brief list of reasons for the Nomination. As of the 22nd of March I have not received any nominations. Your District Director will select one nominee from those that are received for both CW and SSB and forward that selection with the reasons for the selection to the Election Coordinator no later than April 15th. Prior winners are not eligible for this award. Please support the members that go out of their way to make this club thrive

and advise your Director who you think they are. By the time you read this it will already be too late to nominate anyone to your director, as the director can only forward a recommendation that has been received by March 31st.

MARAC Voting Information

Remember, if you are a new member or are REJOINING following a lapse in membership, you are NOT eligible to submit nominations or vote in an election until the first day of the month following receipt of initial payment of dues and valid membership application to the Secretary of MARAC. Those individuals maintaining uninterrupted membership status are not restricted from nominating or voting in the current month.

Please include your callsign, MARAC membership and key numbers along with your choices for each class.

A vote for 1st choice is awarded 2 points and 2nd choice is awarded 1 point. **Please do not vote for the same call for both choices.** Of course any choices can be left blank.

Several folks, including Charlie, WB0HLW solved my mystery question about the 1979 MARAC Annual Convention (which was held in Atlanta as it turns out).

Also, many thanks to Joyce, WB9NUL and Barry, W9UCW for shipping me a nice big box full of CH History ... plaques, certificates, pictures, and even a special one-of-a-kind County Hunting trophy from the distant past.

Ahhh ... so much history, so little time.

A neat and fun story, as shown below in its entirety, appeared in the August 1989 Roadrunner concerning Suzie, W5UGD and her husband Dick, W5RIT. The tactics of Keith, W7KEU especially interest me since I'm only (hah!) 107 counties away from getting my first star ... that surprise eyeball QSO idea seems quite promising! Moreover, the response to it all by Suzie and Dick was most refreshing to read about.

Oh yeah, for those that think I may have busted some call signs for this story ... Suzie Hoyt (USA-CA 719) passed away in 1997, and Dick Hoyt (USA-CA 733) passed away in 2005. Their son, John Hoyt, subsequently obtained Suzie's old call sign (W5UGD) for himself and Dick's old call sign (W5RIT) for his XYL Pamela. And that, as the late Paul Harvey would say, is the rest of the story.
