I am happy to update last month's article on Georgia Counties by saying that I finally worked my last one there ... Terrell County ... #159. That's the good news. Unfortunately, it means that I have to send yet another MRC to Jeffrey, AF3X who got that county for me on his way to the Southeast Mini.

For those that may not be aware of my adventures in getting Jeffrey to simply <u>verify</u>, <u>sign</u>, and <u>return</u> an MRC, please note that he confirmed the last four counties I submitted to him by writing the QSO information on (1) A Chicken Burrito Wrapper, (2) Two Sheets of 2-Ply Toilet Paper, (3) The Inside of a Twinkies Box, and (4) A Taco Shell. So, for Terrell County, I have no clue what The Master of MRC Disaster might dream up this time regarding my submitted MRC.

In June of 2011 my son Justin, KG4VBK and I took a short drive to Wise County, Virginia. Silver, N9QS needed the county to complete his quest for Worked All Counties with 1x3 Call Signs. A WBOW plaque (my first) was too tempting to pass up for such a close-by county, so away we went!

Wise County seemed like a pretty interesting place considering the short time we were there. The county was formed in 1856 with land taken from Lee, Scott, and Russell Counties ... and named after Henry A. Wise, who had just become the Governor of Virginia. The coal industry first came to Wise County in the 1880's ... during that time period the county seat of Gladeville saw thousands of acres of land bought and sold each month. The city of Gladeville was renamed Wise in 1924 as business boomed commercially and the area featured new schools, hospitals, and prosperity.

It was definitely <u>not</u> a good radio day when we were there! However, we managed to complete a couple of contacts with Silver as well as run the county on both SSB and CW.

In between CH runs, we were able to admire the Wise County scenery. Being in the Appalachian Mountains as well as the Jefferson National Forest presented quite a nature's treat. Justin took a bunch of pictures, one of which is shown below. Yep, it was a wise decision to visit old Wise County that day!
