MARAC 2012 Elections Announcement

Nominations are currently open for the positions of President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer (all 2 year terms). Nominations are also open for the positions of Great Lakes Director, North Central Director (2 year terms) and Southeast Director (3 year term). Nominations will be open for 60 days. They are open from January 5th through March 10th. Any current member of MARAC is eligible to run for office. For the District Director positions you must live within the district which is listed on the MARAC website.

If you are willing to serve MARAC in an elected position, please send your nomination to <u>KR@GCI.</u> **NET** or via regular mail, which I must receive by March 10th.

MARAC VOTING INFORMATION

Remember, if you are a new member or are <u>REJOINING</u> following a lapse in membership, you are <u>NOT</u> eligible to submit nominations or vote in an election until the first day of the month following receipt of initial payment of dues and valid membership application to the Secretary of MARAC.

Those individuals maintaining uninterrupted membership status are not restricted from nominating or voting in the current month.

If you are unsure of your membership status, please go to the MARAC County Hunters Database web site http://marac.org/database and enter your call in Call Lookup to determine your MARAC Expiration Date.

MARAC 2nd QUARTER AWARD VOTING October – December

Voting will be open from January 1st through January 31st for the best net control, mobile and team awards. The easiest way to place your vote is at the MARAC On-Line Ballot site http://marac.org/elections/. All you will need to enter on the sign in page is your call sign and your MARAC key. If you have lost or do not know your key then enter your callsign and then click on the button below to request your key. The key will be emailed to your email address on record right away. You may also send me your vote via regular mail. However I must receive the ballot by the closing date of the voting window to be counted. Please include your callsign, MARAC membership and key numbers along with your choices for each class.

A vote for 1st choice is awarded 2 points and 2nd choice is awarded 1 point. Please do not vote for the same call for both choices. Of course any choices can be left blank.

44th MARAC Convention

During your stay in Vancouver for the MARAC Convention, there are plenty of sights to see within walking distance. If you are not a walker the drive time is minimal. Vancouver, WA and Portland, OR, are a sight-seer's paradise. There are many places to satisfy a tourist's appetite. (Food opportunities in the Vancouver area will appear in another edition of the roadrunner). If you enjoy antiques, collectables, or pawn shop treasurers there are plenty of these shops in downtown Vancouver. Both Vancouver and Portland have parks, small boutiques, and malls. Some of the scenery is close-by, and there is much more within a couple of hours' drive.

The Red Lion has 400 parking spots, all outside and uncovered, so accommodating antennas should not be a problem. Contact Phil if you plan to bring your RV; He can help with your accommodations.

Just a few blocks from the Red Lion is Esther Short Park with a bell tower and glockenspiel that play every other hour from Noon to 8 p.m. The Farmer's Market is in the park on weekends during the summer. East of the hotel is the Old Apple Tree Park. The apple tree was planted in 1826 with seeds brought from London, possibly by Emilius Simpson. Beside the park is the south end of the Land Bridge and Interpretive Trail, part of the Confluence Project that celebrated the 200th anniversary of the Lewis and Clark Expedition. At the north end of the Land Bridge is the Fort Vancouver National Historic Site. A reconstruction of the original fort build in 1825 by the Hudson's Bay Company and used as a fur trading post. The visitor's Center for the Fort is a great source of local information and souvenirs of the area.

Just east of the Fort is the Pearson Air Museum and Pearson Airfield. The airfield is one of the oldest airfields in the United States and still in operation. This is an interesting historical museum site with coverage of local military flyers from past wars. Some well known flyers that landed here were Charles Lindbergh, Eddie Rickenbacker, and Jimmy Doolittle.

The first transpolar airplane flight from Russia to the United States landed in Vancouver on June 20th, 1937. The trip was planned to terminate in San Francisco, but because of weather conditions and low fuel, they surprised everyone by landing here. The primary pilot of the flight, Valery Chkalov became a household name in Russia and around the world, he was known as "The Russian Lindberg". Chkalov was accompanied by co-pilot Georgy Baidukov, and navigator Alexander Belyakov.

This gives you an idea of some of our history here in Vancouver. You may walk to these places or drive. We will have local area maps in the hospitality room for your use.

History Happens

The state of Arizona will officially celebrate its 100th birthday on February 14, 2012. President Lincoln signed the proclamation that made Arizona the 48th state of the union 100 years earlier. Arizona's Centennial Celebration has already begun with events statewide in its 15 counties.

Arizona has some unique county names that are not found in most other states ... names that are derived from Native American Tribes such as Navajo, Apache, Yavapai, and Cochise. Yavapai was one of the four original Arizona Counties. In 1891, the present boundaries of Yavapai County were established after breaking off four new counties ... the aforementioned Apache and Navajo along with Coconino and Maricopa ... leading Yavapai to often be called "The Mother of Arizona Counties."

The neatest thing to me about Yavapai is what happens when I typo the county name. On a standard QWERTY keyboard, the "Y" key is directly above the "H" key. A simple mistake in typing results in the county name being entered as "Havapai" ... which, when spoken aloud, sounds like "Have-a-Pie."

Yes indeed, I am a big-time connoisseur of pies. In particular, I love cream pies such as Chocolate, Banana (with real banana slices), Key Lime, and Lemon Meringue. Cherry, Apple, and Peach pies are also great as long as the fruit is well-cooked, soft, and warm.

So, you're thinking I've gone all wobbly again ... well, not necessarily. You see, Yavapai County is home of the historic Rock Springs Café and it's world-famous homemade pies! In fact, their pie recipes date back to the early 1900's. On the day before Thanksgiving 2010, they sold over 3,000 pies ... and then had to open up again on Thanksgiving Day itself in order to handle the overwhelming demand. Now you can order online and have their pies shipped right to your front door. Hmm, thinking ...
