Boy it is hot; the shack air conditioner is running overtime. I set my mail and box of pastries on the desk and turn on the radio. I hear Gator slide to a stop at the recycled railroad tie; he comes in bearing a gift of supersized lattes. He hands me a latte and I point to the white cardboard box, "Have a fritter, you look worried, what is the problem?" Gator gets a fritter, "I just read in the newspaper there is now federal protection for the Miami Blue butterfly in the Florida Keys." "So what?" Gator flushes the fritter with a shot of latte, "Suppose Jim, VA3XOV, drives from Canada to Florida to run Monroe county and to see a Miami Blue butterfly and does not see one, will he still run Monroe county?" The printer starts, it is a list of the mobile's heard during April on the county hunters CW frequencies: AB4YZ, AB7RW, AF3X, K2HVN, K2RP, K4YFH, K7TM, and K8QWY. KA4RRU, KB6UF, KC7YE, KW1DX, N0KV, N4JT, N5XG, N7IV, N9JF, ND9M, NT7A, NT7R, VA3XOV, W0GXQ, W0NAC, W3DQT, W3DYA, W3FF, W4SIG, W7FEN, W7IN, W9GHX, W9MSE, WA8REI, and WB4KZW..

This month the CW operators will have a dit-dit of a time. There is the 7th Call Area QSO party with 8 States and 258 counties up for grabs, The Indiana QSO party with 92 counties and the New England QSO party with 6 States and 67 counties. There is also the 10-10 Spring CW contest and I plan to operate in this contest. There is the Nevada Mustang Roundup where you can work 17 Nevada counties. Want some CW DX try the His Majesty King of Spain CW contest. To finish up the month is the CQ WW WPX contest, and you get to use serial numbers. Maybe I can use my microwave oven and operate CW in the Microwave Spring Sprint by opening and shutting the oven door. Naw, sounds like too much work and anyway it is nap time. I wonder how many naps W3DYA takes.

History Happens

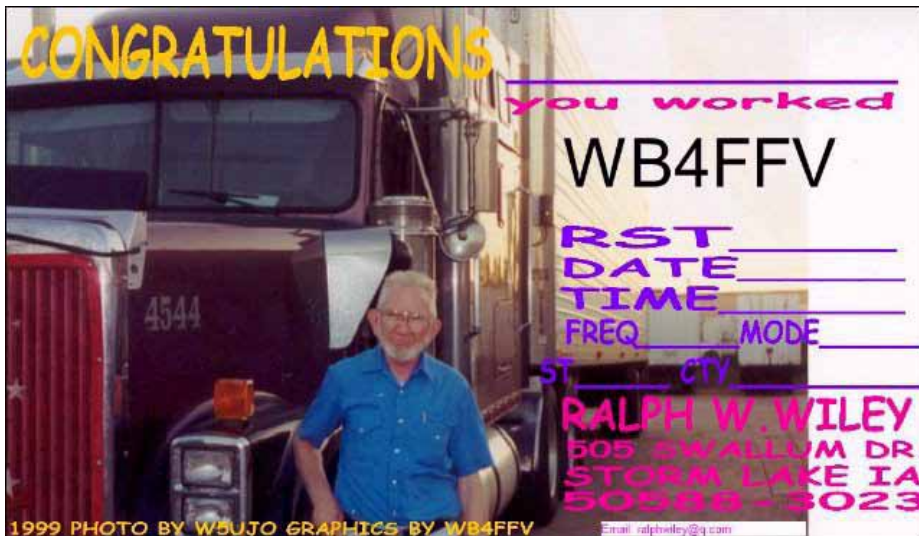
On 25 October 1982 he worked Dale, WB9YCO/mobile in Outagamie County, Wisconsin for #1. On 19 March 2012 he worked Ron, KB6UF/mobile in Limestone County, Alabama for #3077. Over those nearly thirty years, Ralph Wiley, WB4FFV worked a lot of counties as well as passed out a lot of counties.

Ralph drove his own 18-wheeler (aka, Big Rig to County Hunters) hauling meat and produce. He generally ran from the Midwest to the West coast and back. He also ran into upstate New York and into Boston on a few occasions, as well as into the Southeast (NC, SC, AL, MS, and LA). He racked up between 140,000 to 160,000 miles per year until 2001, then cut back to 120,000 miles per year. Ralph finally got off of the road in December 2007 saying proudly "I did it with no accidents and no tickets."

Ralph's transmitted county total includes all 99 counties in Iowa, all 105 in Kansas, all 66 in South Dakota, and all 23 in Wyoming. Many folks benefited from Ralph's Big Rig travels ... helping Ralph finish up became a priority for County Hunters. In recent months, trips by N4AAT, N4CD, KB6UF, and KB0BA/N0XYL made it possible for Ralph to git-er-done!

On 13 April 2012 (aka, Friday the 13th) Ralph Wiley, WB4FFV received USA-CA number 1225 from CQ Magazine. Ralph commented "I would like to say THANK YOU to everyone that gave me a new county ... they were as important as the last county."

The lasting memory for me in chasing USA-CA is my world-class collection of unusual MRC's. In every single instance, I mailed a standard, legitimate, proper MRC to the mobile station I worked. But it's what I got back that has made for some lasting MRC Memories.

In early May 2010, I mailed Kent, KL1V several MRC's and SASE for eastern counties (PA, NY, MA, NJ, etc) he had run in April. I got my SASE back in late May, proudly thinking at the time that I had a new pile of confirmed counties safely in-hand.

But, as you can see from the picture below, my SASE was filled with various pieces of Kent's junk mail. No MRC could be found! While some of the items could be considered handy (especially that nifty danger tag), I was really expecting signed MRC's to be in that return envelope. A few days later, the signed MRC's arrived ... but really now ... junk mail?
