<u>State of Kansas:</u> MARAC's new Secretary, WQ7A, is working with MARAC's General Counsel (Bill, K0DEQ) to get MARAC back into a status of "Good Standing" State of Kansas. Because MARAC is incorporated in the state of Kansas, MARAC is required to submit an Annual report and pay a filing fee of \$40 each year. MARAC has not sent in the Annual report nor the filing fee since 2014. As part of the reinstatement process MARAC needs to send the Annual Report and filing fees for 2015 and 2016 as well as a reinstatement fee.

<u>Resident Agent:</u> To be incorporated in the state of Kansas MARAC is required to have a valid Kansas mailing address. To do this we must have what is called a Resident Agent (RA). Butch, WY0A, has volunteered to be MARAC's Resident Agent.

Each of these positions had multiple volunteers and I am very pleased to see the renewed enthusiasm. While not all of these folks have been appointed to a position, their willingness to volunteer their time and knowledge is greatly appreciated. A CW mobile county hunter's location signal is as good as his RST.

Awards Committee Reorganization

As most members are probably aware, the Awards Committee ceased to function several weeks ago prior to the national convention. Submissions from members during that time have not been processed and entry of LC-1 or LC-2 awards was discouraged until a new committee was established and transfer of records could occur. At the quarterly Marac Board of Directors Meeting on Thursday, August 25, 2016, I was appointed as the Marac Awards Manager.

A new position, Awards Secretary, was proposed to the board and discussed. This position would handle the processing of awards applications, issuance of awards and certificates, preparation and shipping of plaques, and handling of funds for the awards function. That proposal was adopted, but will need to be incorporated into the official club bylaws by an amendment that will be voted on by the membership in the near future. It is anticipated that N2JNE, Charlie Steele, will assume the duties of Award Secretary if the bylaw changes are approved by the membership.

I will be working with all of the directors to establish a new Awards Committee representing each of the districts. That work is just beginning and I will keep the members updated on progress through this section of the newsletter in future months.

Status of Awards Operations

We are working to resume processing of awards applications and will do so as soon as the records and systems can be analyzed, bank accounts established, checks obtained, and systems brought online with new security parameters. Please be patient with the committee as this process is completed.

I look forward to resuming operations and staffing the new committee at the earliest possible date. Then, we will start evaluation of new awards and rules changes for the club.
