Try operating in a non-American state QSO party experience, do the Ontario QSO party. Stop reading for a minute and take a long sip of iced tea, relax.

Maybe contesting is the RF additive in your blood, so do the Hungarian Straight Key Contest, the CQ Manchester Mineira DX contest. Feel like a computer challenge then do the 10-10 International Spring Digital Contest. There are 20 activities for the CW nut, it’s your choice. As you are probably aware MARAC is having problems created by easyCGI, our internet server. In the meantime, there is a temporary fix for updating the Logger program. The latest version of the program and latest version of the Logger database are available on the MARAC.ORG/CHDownloads site. There are two short text files explaining the procedures. On another note, the Logger team, headed by KD9ZP, would solicit some help. With the loss of KD5CXO we need someone who can take over the editing of the Logger Help file. This would entail changes made to Logger and correcting errors found. Some minor computer skill would help. We would also entertain the idea of one or more Logger users that could help with Logger distribution and installation as the need arises. If you would like to volunteer for either of these two positions, (or both), get in touch with KD9ZP.

Down the road we would like to see a volunteer team to help with the possibility of a future Logger II. Obviously we would need a major volunteer to code a new version, but that person should have the help of several volunteers to fill the writing/editing of a Help file, How To file, testing and distribution of a new program.
