I am writing to you today because we are at a crossroad in our efforts to obtain passage of The Amateur Radio Parity Act.

Our legislative efforts scored a major victory in our campaign when The Amateur Radio Parity Act, S. 1534 now moves to the Senate, where we need every Senator to approve the bill. This is the companion Bill to H.R. 555, which passed in the House of Representatives in January.

You are one of over 730,000 licensed Amateur Radio Operators living in the United States. Many of you already live in deed-restricted communities, and that number grows daily.

A county hunter knows the county, not only by the name, but also by the State.

I arrived at the radio shack earlier than usual to turn on the air conditioner. The weatherman on the commercial radio system indicated it was going to be another scorcher and for some reason I glanced at the calendar. I shook my head in disbelief; it was the month of August, why is time is such a hurry to arrive and go? I flip the page and start reading the August calendar. Second Mobile Bakeoff (Mobile Transmitted Signal Test) By Larry Benko, W0QE

Much of the fun of operating mobile is making contacts. Would you like to know the relative strength of your mobile signal compared to others? The convention affords us the opportunity to have several mobiles together and perform a controlled test of everyone's setup. I would like to encourage everyone to participate even if you think your signal is not as strong as you might like as collecting more data will help us all, especially the new comers. Participation will take only a few minutes to do a single antenna on 1 or 2 bands. Feel free to bring more than one antenna and transmit on any bands you wish. We will measure the vertical and horizonal magnitude of your transmitted signal at a takeoff angle of 10-15 degrees.

We did a measurement like this 10 years ago at the last MARAC convention in Denver and most participants had fun (I think).

Time: We will set up Monday morning Sept. 25 and will be ready to begin before noon and will continue until dusk. Please stop by.

Format: Similar to the first "Mobile Bakeoff". You will center your vehicle on the transmit location and transmit a brief 100% duty cycle signal on any frequencies that you operate on. The signal can be CW, RTTY, FM (mic gain set to 0) etc. I will expect the power level to be 100W unless you say otherwise.

Outcome: I will produce a video and make it available to MARAC and publish it my YouTube channel. The video will show the measurement data, description, vehicle*, antenna*, setup*, operator*, and mention operators name* and call sign*. If you are shy or wish to remain anonymous, you can opt out of any of the items with an asterisk and you will be called "Participant XYZ" with a verbal description of your antenna and setup. In all cases, license plates will be obscured.

Location: Vacant dirt field on northeast corner of the convention site

New TN Motorist Law

Tennessee has passed an extension of the "Move-Over" law that could have bearing on mobiles who are stopped while operating in TN.

The original law requires motorists to move over allowing a clear lane between an approaching vehicle when a parked emergency vehicle with legal warning lighting is stopped in, or on, the side of a highway, or to slow 15 mph below posted speed limit. It applies to all roadways, divided multi-lanes to our famous "dog-path" backroads.

A new part was added, effective July 1, 2017, that requires motorist who encounter a parked motorist on the shoulder with emergency flashers working is to be allowed the same safe space and speed reduction as for an emergency vehicle.

Exactly how this will work isn't covered in the addition, so expect some discussions from the courts and officers to work out details. If you are running a county while sitting on the side of the road with flashers on, everyone else has to move over or slow down 15 mph. It will probably result in an officer asking you to move on if there is no vehicle problem. Please don't try stopping over a waterline on a bridge, either.

If you are in a pullout to the right of a paved shoulder or on the grass to the right the shoulder, there isn't supposed to be a problem based on the letter of the law.

One situation not worked out is if you are stopped on the shoulder with no flashers activated. It is a new law for Tennessee's motorists, officers and courts. It might take some time to fine tune what the full scope of the new addition allows or prohibits, so please be courteous to the officers and remember you'll get a day in court.

The new law is to allow for safety of all motorists, both the stopped ones and the ones passing by.

Whereas, despite these short-comings which I feel should be made public, he is a fine and top-notch county hunter and always willing and able to give assistance when needed and,


Whereas, he no doubt will accept the Ugly Award with pride and dignity and,
