Your MARAC Board of Directors will be taking turns addressing the membership in this monthly article. Hopefully, we can provide multiple perspectives of our wonderful hobby!

First of all, I can comment that hurricane Isaias affected Connecticut and the Northeast severely. There were a number of trees that came down and power was out for many for up to a week. Some had their power restored only to lose it again as they brought others back on-line. My power never went out, but I did have a few "brown outs" that reset the cable box a number of times. I probably should have lowered the tower because it was whipping in the wind like a tree, all 65 feet of it, but it survived. We normally do not get winds much over 30 to 35 MPH here but this one brought some heavier winds, maybe closer to 50 MPH. It is just that the towers go down easier than going up, but I should have taken the tower down to 21 feet and spent the next day or so cranking it back up two or three turns at a time. I guess I did not watch this one as closely as I should have but got lucky.

The new solar cycle is starting to heat up. There have been a number of new spots associated with the new cycle and also a few "B" and "C" flares. 6, 10 and 12 meters have been hot, in fact 10 meter digital got me almost 70 new contacts one day and a few new band counties and new digital counties. ### Voting Tidbits

The 1<sup>st</sup> quarter voting will be slightly different than what everyone has been previously accustomed to. Instead of voting for 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> place on each award, you will now vote for "UP TO TWO (2) individuals on each award.

You will still be voting for the following awards.

- SSB - Mobile of the Year
- CW - Mobile of the Year
- Mobile Team of the Year
- SSB Mobile Assist of the Year
- CW Mobile Assist of the Year

Each quarter a ballot will automatically be sent to you from Simply Voting. Vote for **UP TO TWO (2)** individuals you feel are most deserving during this quarter, which includes the months of June, July and August. Enter a check mark in the appropriate box and their call sign in the "Write-in" field.

When voting for a Mobile Team, enter both call signs in the write-in field. Ex: W1ABC/W1XYZ. **A slash ( / ) must be entered between the two call signs.**

Check your entries (call sign) for each award for accuracy. When you are finished voting, click on **CONTINUE** and then **CONFIRM**. ***If you do NOT enter the call sign correctly, the vote will NOT count in the final tabulation. Please double check your entries.***

- ***NEW - if you receive an error after clicking on CONTINUE, read which question the error is connected with, go back and correct the entry and click on CONTINUE. You will need to do this for each question that has an error.***
- ***Possible errors - a check mark is entered without a call sign. To fix - enter a call sign in the "Write-in" box where you've entered the check mark.***
- ***You entered the same call sign for the same question. To fix - enter 2 DIFFERENT call signs for each question.***

Simply Voting has safety features in place to prevent you from entering the same call sign for each question and from voting more than once.

You now have the opportunity to vote for 1 or 2 individuals per question. If you vote for only 1 person you **CAN NOT** abstain on your second choice. You only abstain if you don't care to vote for anyone. You can also leave the entire question blank. However, PLEASE CONSIDER VOTING FOR THOSE INDIVIDUALS WHO HAVE BEEN RUNNING COUNTIES AND ASSISTING THE MOBILES. IF YOU HAVE RECEIVED RELAYS FROM SOMEONE, OR HEARD SOMEONE HELPING WITH RELAYS, CONSIDER VOTING FOR THEM. THOSE WHO ASSIST ARE A TREMENDOUS HELP TO THE MOBILES, ESPECIALLY WITH THE LACK OF PROPAGATION.

If you receive a reminder email from Simply Voting **AFTER** you have voted, your ballot did **NOT** go thru. Follow the instructions on the 2nd email. To complete the voting process be sure to click on **CONTINUE** and then **CONFIRM.**

## Revised Version of MARAC Award Rules was Published on July 1, 2020

This revised document incorporates rules changes approved by the Board of Directors. It has been uploaded to the MARAC website and can be found by clicking on the "Awards" button in the main menu and then the "Award Rules" button in the sub-menu.

The only rules modifications were as follows:

1. Deletion of the Net Control of the Year - SSB and CW awards (effective 7/1/2019).
2. Rewrite of the MARAC Achievement Awards rule.
3. Rewrite of the Mobile of the Year - SSB rule.
4. Rewrite of the Mobile of the Year – CW rule.
5. Rewrite of the Mobile Team of the Year rule.
6. Addition of the Mobile Assist of the Year - SSB and CW rule.

Note: The yellow highlighting shown in other awards is not new. That highlighting was the same in the previous revision of the rules and was left there for emphasis.

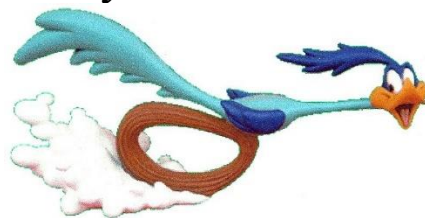
