County Hunter Web.org

In my opinion, one of the most useful tools available to county hunters is the webpage that **Don**, **K3IMC** created some years ago. If you are not familiar with it the web address is simply www.countyhunterweb.org

Here you can find three main areas of Don's helpful site. The first is the FORUM. This is where county hunters go to either post info or read up on what is going on daily in the county hunting world. If you don't check it regularly you are missing out! Often times mobiles announce here when they are heading out on a trip. Often a question is asked with others sharing their experience and knowledge. Often announcements are made here of awards that have just been issued. You can also find out what others may be doing outside of chasing counties.Don't be afraid to post something yourself, whether in response to someone else's post, or initiating your own thought. We are all here to support one another, so jump on in! PLEASE NOTE that this is not a complaint department. Don advises to keep it positive and understanding toward others. This is good advice!

The second area you can choose from this website it the SPECIAL NEEDS. This is where you can look to see what others are needing to finish up a particular award in a state. YOU can also list your needs. This is very advisable and many active mobiles, myself included, always check here first before planning a mobile trip. If I am going close to one of your needs I make an effort to include it on my route. If you don't have your needs listed then you are missing out on alerting mobiles on how to help you out. Entering your needs is easy, give it a try!

The third and final section of this webpage is the PLANNED TRIPS area. This is where mobiles post all the fine details of an upcoming mobile trip. Look over these details and compare to your needs. Then you can follow along with the mobile on their route and pounce on those needed counties along the way.

This website is extremely valuable. Many county hunters have been using it for years. If you haven't had an opportunity to check it out lately, or ever, now is an excellent time to take advantage of such a useful tool to your county chasing endeavours!

Again...thanks so much for **Don K3IMC** for providing this extremely useful tool to all county hunters!

How to Receive County Alerts

(Or: How to receive alerts on your smart phone when a county you need has been posted)

This article was in a *RoadRunner* about a year ago, but I have received several questions regarding it since then, so thought I would reprint this info...

When sitting by the rig it is relatively easy to watch the county spots and have Logger notify you when a county has been posted that you need. But, what about when you are not sitting by the computer, but are in the next room or across the house? What if you are mobile and don't want to miss counties you need while driving? Thanks to the W6RK web page there is a very handy way to resolve this. Simply by setting up "alerts" for the counties you need, you will receive an instant email or text when that elusive county is initially posted! There is nothing like a "ding" coming from your smart phone to let you know a hot one is on the air.

Utilizing the W6RK spotting site you can customize everything. Here is how it works. First, make sure that your smart phone (iphone or android, doesn't matter which) is set up to receive your emails and that your phone emits a noise of some sort each time you receive a new email. If you need help with this, you can look on the internet or ask your favorite millennial or 10 year old grandchild how to set this up. Next, go to <u>ch.w6rk.com/alerts</u>. This page will explain how to get set up and how to use this feature. Once your account is set up you will be able to very easily click on each county that you want an email alert on. Simple.

I cannot tell you how many times I have been away from the computer yet have been alerted in this fashion where I didn't miss that much needed county. It really helps when you are mobile and don't want to miss out on other mobiles. It also helps when you are working in the yard, shopping at the store, or anywhere else where you can't sit by the rig but have your cell phone in your pocket.

NOTE: **If you would rather receive your alerts as a text message** (the preferred and much faster method!!) than an email, then you can do that instead. When you set up your alerts with the W6RK site and it asks for your email you put in your cell phone number in the format that your cellphone carrier utilizes. For example if your cell number is 123-456-7890 this is what you would put in:

For Sprint Users: <u>1234567890@messaging.sprintpcs.com</u>

For Verizon Users: <u>1234567890@vtext.com</u>

For ATT Users: <u>1234567890@txt.att.net</u>

For you folks chasing different Books (like prefixes, bands, modes, etc) you can actually set up a separate account for each. That way you will only get an alert when the posted county matches what you need it for! There is no limit on how many accounts you can set up. (Thanks to K2MF for this tip!)

Of course, none of this works if a mobile is not spotted. **PLEASE SPOT YOUR MOBILES**!!
