New County Hunter Tip of the Month

KNOW YOUR MOBILE

As **Jerry W0GXQ** has said many times, "Know your Mobile"! This is an excellent tip for those chasing the counties of mobiles all over the country. Like most CW ops have some little unique characteristic that helps identify them, most mobiles are unique as well. It is important to understand this and to learn the characteristics of the active mobiles.

For example, band rotation is very important. A lot of mobiles have a consistent band/mode rotation that they follow. They may go from 20SSB to 40SSB, then 20CW and lastly 40CW. Or they may go from 20SSB to 20CW, then 30CW, 40SSB, 40SSB. Sometimes a particular band is not open for you and you must be ready for the next opportunity/band that comes along. Some mobiles will alternate their rotation for different parts of the day, or even eliminate some bands that drop out and add others that are opening up later in the day.

Some mobiles religiously spot themselves (when they have cell coverage), yet others rely upon others like YOU to spot them. Also, notice that the spotting page that you may be following has a delay from when the county is spotted and when it finally shows up on your pc. If you are not at-theready, you may miss the opportunity to get the county you need on that band. This is especially true if the mobile does not spot themselves, as the spot may have occurred late into the county run. There are even mobiles that know this and will spot themselves a full minute before they start their county run. So, if you tune in too quickly, you may not hear anything and think that propagation is not in your favor, yet if you hang around for that mobile to start his operation you find copy is good.

There are mobiles that invite communication from you via text, while others turn their phones completely off for most of the day. This is especially helpful if you barely missed a county and want to beg them to meet you back on that band. (Warning: do not use this one too often! Hi!) You can often find out a mobile's preferences when reading about their planned trip details on the "Planned Trip" portion of the countyhunterweb.org website.

While not too many, there are some mobiles that like to start their days before the coffee is made in most homes or run way past the cows come in. Know which ones those are. Also, this information might be found in their "Planned Trips" info. Quite a few mobiles will also make a post with "QRT" when they are done for the day. That way you know to not monitor any more for them that day. Yet, if you know that is their habit, don't dare assume they are done for the day until they say they are.

Knowing the characteristics of your mobiles can greatly enhance your chances of getting all the counties you need from them. Follow their trends and take notes. Good luck!!
