Most Amazing County Feat Ever?

I started my county hunting mobile journey back in 1978. Throughout the years I have set some pretty incredibly difficult awards goals for myself. I am sure that you have too. It still amazes me what county hunters set out to accomplish and the mountain they have set before them to climb. When I think I have really accomplished something in this hobby, I am quickly reminded and humbled at what some of my friends in this crazy world of county hunting have already accomplished! As soon as I remind myself of one hill that has been climbed, I recall yet another and another. I ask myself, "what is the greatest county hunting achievement to date"? Here are some of my favorites...

Ran all counties mobile: Are you kidding me?? Last I checked there are 3077 of them, with a few way out in the Pacific Ocean and several more above the frozen tundra of the Arctic Circle! Yet, here we are, with 18 hams, with **K3IMC** being the most recent, who have spent thousands of hours on the road, thousands in dollars on gas, hotels, and plane flights, and countless hours planning, navigating, and logging all those county runs. Did you now that we even have **N4CD** who did it, started all over again, and finished a second time around? Unbelievable! I think **K8ZZ** would be the next to approach this milestone...

Worked all counties on a single band/mode: As many of you realize, once you have obtained USA-CA you have probably worked the majority of counties on 20 or 40 meters. But how about striving to work them ALL on a single band? This can be difficult, especially if you need 20 meter contacts on neighboring counties. Some have waited years for unique band conditions while others have traveled away from home to enable them to work counties close to home! Then how about the "other" bands? 30, 17, 80, etc? KC3X and K8QWY are the only holders of 5-Band-Counties Award for 2000 counties, with KC3X having accomplished the 3000 county level!! Amazing!

W0GXQ was the first to complete them all on 30m back in 2006. **N4AAT** was the first to get all 3077 on 40m in 2011. **AC2J** was the first to get all counties on 20m back in 2005. And **K5GE** finished them all on 17m in 2015.

Did you know that two MARAC members have worked all counties on 2 meters??? Yep, **N8KIE** and **N8RLJ** accomplished this while running all counties mobile together. What a team!!

Working them all on a single mode sounds challenging, but how about all on one mode multiple times??? **W0GXQ** has worked them all on CW 7 times!

Worked all counties QRP: Working them all is hard enough, but how about with 5 watts or less? NN9K accomplished this feat a few years ago! I can't imagine doing this now, especially with the band conditions the way they have been for years... But how about WD3P who did it TWICE all CW, the first time in 1996!

Worked all counties while mobile: Yes, this is a thing! 23 members have spent enough time on the road to accomplish this whopper.

Worked DXCC while mobile: This one, too, requires a lot of time in the mobile. But how about N3AHA who has worked over 320 DX entries from his sled!

Worked all counties multiple times: Well, here's one that is going to be hard to match. **KZ2P** has worked them all 19 times. Geesh!

Worked all counties with all prefixes: All "W", "K", "N", "A" prefixes? It used to be unfathomable to work all counties with stations with an "A" prefix. Now, the "W" seems almost as tough. Only 9 members have completed this extremely difficult goal, with **WQ7A** having just completed it last week.

Giving out over 2000 last counties: We all appreciate a last county from a mobile. As a way of thanking the mobile, MARAC makes it easy for us to apply for a Last County award for the mobile at no charge. Did you know **N4CD** has been awarded over 2,700 times? Unbelievable!

Working all counties and running mobile while blind: No, I am not making this one up. WA6VJP was a Korean War veteran and worked all counties, all CW, five times. He also gave out over 100 Last Counties running mobile while his wife drove. Ed was also an excellent CW Net Control for many years.

MARAC awards available but waiting for #1: Natural Bingo, USA-CA all digital, No Star, All 80 meters, All 15 meters, Bingo Cinco, XX Star etc.

Have I missed some unique and amazing county hunting feats? Probably so...send me your thoughts on some I may have overlooked or was not aware of. I would love to spread the word as we have some awesome county hunters in our midst and their tremendous accomplishments should be noted!






CHOTY Nomination Schedule for 2022

Nominations are Now Open for County Hunter of the Year - SSB and CW

Nominations open February 1st for CHOTY for the 12-month period of activity ending January 31, 2022. Individuals who won a category in the prior two years (listed below) are ineligible to be nominated for that same category this year.

Deadline for Nominations from the Membership

The deadline for nominations to be received by the District Directors is Wednesday. March 9th.

Objective of the County Hunter of the Year Award

From the current rule for County Hunter of the Year – SSB and CW in MARAC's Award Rules document (page 16), subsection "Objective":

"To recognize members of MARAC who have made a significant overall contribution to MARAC and county hunting during the 12 months immediately prior to start of nominations for this award."

Eligibility Requirements for this Year's Nominees

As noted last year, the Board of Directors changed the Bylaws of MARAC concerning "Eligibility for MARAC Awards" in December, 2020 to read (in part) as follows:

"MARAC Awards are available to any licensed amateur radio operator anywhere in the world except that the County Hunter of the Year, Mobile Assist of the Year, Mobile Team of the Year, and Mobile of the Year Awards may only be received by a member of MARAC,".

Therefore, please ensure that anyone you might to wish to nominate for County Hunter of the Year is a member in good standing of MARAC by checking their dues expiration date in their personal callsign account record in the CH Database located on the MARAC website. If their dues have expired or will expire within the next three months, they may not be eligible to receive the award.

Special Rules Pertaining to the CHOTY Award

From the current rule for County Hunter of the Year – SSB and CW in MARAC's Award Rules document (page 16), subsection "Special Rules":

"The recipients of this award are determined by an annual ballot of the MARAC membership. The vote is conducted before each annual meeting. The candidates for the award are nominated by MARAC District Directors.

Each District Director may select one nominee for each category (SSB/CW) to be placed on the ballot from among the nominees submitted by MARAC members from that Director's district.

The District Director must receive nominations not later than the end of the fourth month preceding the annual meeting or by the deadline annual in the MARAC newsletter.

The District Director must forward his or her selection and reasons for the nomination to the Awards Manager by the middle of the following month.

If the Awards Manager receives more than three nominations for a category, the Awards Committee will select the three nominees for each category for the ballot.

If less than three nominations are received from District Directors, the Awards Committee may select additional nominees to bring the number of nominees for the ballot up to three.

Criteria for consideration for County Hunter of the Year include the following:

- Quality and quantity of operating to provide Valid Contacts from multiple counties while in Mobile Operation or while assisting mobile county hunters as a Net Control Station (NCS) or assistant NCS.
- Participation in MARAC activities and service to MARAC and the members of MARAC.
- 3. Other activities in support of county hunting.

 Technical proficiency in design or usage or implementation of enhancements to mobile operation or county hunting net operations. Overall amateur radio general support in a manner consistent with good operation and advancement of the hobby.

- 5. Member qualification must be based on his/her activities during the previous 12 months, ending on the first day that nominations are accepted.
- 6. MARAC Board members are eligible for this award. However, consideration should not be based upon their fulfillment of their board duties. Their consideration must be based upon activity outside of this such as mobile activity, net assistance activity, spotting activity, service to other members, and general overall enhancement of county hunting.
- 7. A member of MARAC may receive this award multiple times for each category, however, only once every three years for the same category."

Documentation Needed in Nomination Submission

The nomination documentation should include:

1. a written justification of why this nominee should be awarded the County Hunter of the Year award for: a) the designated 12 month activity period (2/1/21 through 1/31/22), and b) the specific category (SSB or CW) that the nominee is being nominated for. If possible, it would be very helpful to members to know the quantity of activity during the 12 month period such as:

- number of days of mobile activity by the nominee for this category
- number of counties transmitted from (total for all trips)
- number of bands typically transmitted from in each county for this category
- number of miles driven (total for all trips)
- total number of contacts made during the year on all bands/modes whether mobile, portable, or fixed (if using Logger subtract the first contact number on the 1st day of the period from the last contact number on the last day of the period).

That justification will eventually be published in the *RoadRunner* and on the electronic ballot if the individual is recommended by their District Director to be a nominee from that district for either the SSB or CW category.

2. A brief biography of the nominee pertaining to their participation in county hunting.

I encourage all members to participate in: a) nominating deserving members for this award, b) voting in the elections (if held), and c) congratulating the ultimate winners and runners-up after the results are announced.

The annual Idaho QSO Party will be held this year on the weekend of March 12 and 13, 2022.. As in the past two years, this year's contest is sponsored by the Magic Valley Amateur Radio Club. There will be some significant changes in how you will submit your logs this year. Participation in the contest has grown substantially over the past two years. In 2021 the MVARC processed nearly 400 logs. Because of the growing participation the need has arisen to find a better and more efficient way of processing the logs. A process is being worked out now and all information on how to submit your log will be listed on the IDQP web (www.pocatelloarc.org/idahoqsoparty) site as soon as the details are finalized. This is a very important step because any logs not meeting the proper criteria will have to be resubmitted until they are correct. This is necessary due to the time it was taking to process incorrectly submitted logs. We are looking forward to the contest again this year and want everyone to have a lot of fun. MARAC SECRETARY DUTIES:

- Is Elected by MARAC membership for a term of 2 years. Can volunteer to serve subsequent terms
- Notifies Board members of date, time, and location of upcoming Board of Director meetings, along with proposed Agenda
- Notifies MARAC webmaster prior to an official Board meeting so that notice can be created at least 7 days prior to a meeting
- Notifies Board members of date and time of conference calls needed for discussing club business
- Creates, from Board input, a meeting Agenda
- Attends and participates in Board conference calls and official BOD meetings. Votes on motions made. Conference calls are usually monthly, official Board meetings are roughly 4 per year.
- Takes the minutes during a Board of Directors Meeting
- After each meeting, distributes a draft of the minutes for Board members to review. A final
 copy of these minutes should be attached to the agenda of the next Board meeting so that
 they can be voted upon for final approval. These minutes are then sent to the MARAC
 webmaster for posting on the marac.org website
- Keeps a list of topics for Board discussion at each monthly conference call.
- Either runs each meeting, or assigns another Board member to run it for him/her.
- Gathers required reports from MARAC positions needed to create the Annual Report each July meeting. Distributes this annual report to the Board for approval. Then sends a copy to the webmaster for publishing on the MARAC website
