MoSpot

There are "new" county hunters on the air in recent months. *This is great and it makes running counties worthwhile.* One of the really useful aspects of county hunting is the **ch.W6RK.com** spot site. It is something I monitor frequently for general interest of who is out and about as well as noticing needed counties.

A few months ago, an article in the MARAC newsletter about spotting reminded me that some among us might be aware of the **MoSpot** app designed for county spotting.

MoSpot (Mobile Spotter) is a web-based app that looks and runs the same on any device with an internet connection-wifi, wired internet, cell phone, etc. I have used on a regular basis running on my MacBook Air, Microsoft Surface GO and iphone. Any internet connected computer, tablet, smartphone with a web browser should be able to run the app. Being web based makes it easy for updates and/or corrections. They are quietly done behind the scenes. You won't need to reinstall anything after an update. It just happens.

MoSpot contains all US counties AND county lines with data provided directly from the Logger system. The program design is mine but K2MF was a great help in designing the method to format data required for the app to function and others contributed with suggestions during testing, and other support as the app developed. **MoSpot** was first released in 2017 and is still used by many today.

The screen capture displayed is **MoSpot**. All spotting functions take place from this screen via drop down lists. Select your state (if you are not already on that state screen), your county, your frequency and tap **SEND TO W6RK SPOT**. That's it!

If your selected frequency is busy or you have another choice, simply tap/click in the frequency field and edit. The various links and more details are explained in the **Online User Guide** found at:

https://www.qsl.net/ka2lho/Spot/Guide.htm

MoSpot was designed to be a fast and simple way to self-spot or spot others (just edit the Spotter Call).

So how can you get **MoSpot**? Email me (kraig@kdpritts.com) and include your call sign and home state. You will get a link to your personalized configuration, usually within a day or so. Where you see my call on the graphic, you will see your own call (always fully editable if working with a team. Nothing to install just a link. Remember, **MoSpot** is entirely web based.

<u>How much does it cost?</u> **Zero, Nada, Zilch, \$0.** As mentioned previously, others assisted in various aspects of data formatting, testing, finding errors and providing input to the overall function. Everyone donated a lot of time and knowledge to make this available to County Hunters. I hope that you find **MoSpot** useful.

Justification

There's A LOT of people who work behind the scenes and don't receive much credit for the hours they spend on what they do. He keeps the Top List current and has it out on time each month. That, in itself, is a huge job. He also has inherited the MARAC db to keep all the entries CORRECT. There's also times he helps K3IMC with Logger II, AND he helps keep the KFF/POTA to counties list current so those working parks know what county the park is in. And there's more I'm sure because Barry is just that kind of guy. Helpful to all county hunters in any way possible. Personally, if I send in my TOPLIST he responds to it within hours. I endorse K2MF for County Hunter of The Year – SSB.

Biography

I have been licensed as an amateur radio operator continuously for 57.5 years, since June 1964. My prior two call signs were WN2NWM from June 1964 - February 1965 and WB2NWM from February 1965 - August 1977. In August 1977, I applied for and received the call sign K2MF which I have had ever since. I chose this suffix because these are the initials of my parents' first names (Marje and Frank) who were instrumental in encouraging me to study and get licensed in the amateur radio service.

I started county hunting in earnest on 4/10/1981, which was nearly 17 years after I was first licensed. I immediately joined MARAC at that time and have been a current member of the club for the past 41 consecutive years. But it took me 31.5 years to finish first time USA-CA because I had two long absences from HF between 8/1/1985 and 9/26/1990 (5+ years) and then again between 8/17/1993 and 11/4/2011 (18+ years). So I was only actually active on HF for about 7.5 of those 31.5 years.

In January of 2016, I took over the job of being the custodian of the County Challenge Award (CCA) Top List. The prior CCA Top List custodians are W6RK (from 2006-2007) and ND9M (from 2008-2015). I have been doing this now for 6 full years and I have familiarized myself with enough Excel programming skills to significantly expand the CCA Top Lists and automate much of how these lists are manufactured each month. The CCA Top Lists now include separate listings of the top three place holders on each band in each mode group, as well as separate listings of those who have achieved the goal of working all 3077 counties on single bands in each mode group.

I also currently maintain the online WWFF KFF-County lookup page, where users can match counties with WWFF KFF-entities. On this list is a cross reference of the POTA K-entries for each KFF-entity as well. This lookup page is part of a much more complex KFF Reference List workbook that was originally created by KA2LHO and which I now maintain in the same fashion that I do for the CCA Top Lists. It also requires that I work closely with WWFF management in the USA so that new entities and required edits get to me on a timely basis.

At the 2018 annual MARAC convention in Kansas City, I agreed to begin doing some behind-the-scenes volunteer work for MARAC. My primary function is to maintain the managed email distribution list for the RoadRunner monthly newsletter, and I developed the current system that is being used to notify the BOD each month about current club membership statistics as well as which club members whose memberships will be expiring over the next month. This list maintenance has taken me into data entry and editing work of a more general nature in the online MARAC DB that is utilized by the MARAC Logger I and II programs to determine for which awards its users qualify. It also requires that I work closely with MARAC treasurer KØDEQ, election coordinator KF7ZN and IT director / Logger II programmer, K3IMC.

Iustification

Don has contributed so much to MARAC and the county hunting community, it is hard to know where to begin. Don has a nice station in western GA where he is chasing all counties for the 4th time. He also makes nice mobile trips each year to help us with our goals. Don did make a big mobile trip out west this year. Don has even worked mobile from all USA counties, only one of 18 county hunters to do so.

Most county hunters are familiar with his countyhunterweb.org site where we all use the Forum, list our needs, and post mobile trips. This site has been used by all of us for MARAC ROADRUNNER

over 30 years now. Don has also recently re-written the awards processing software to enable our awards program to flow smoothly. The biggest news in our hobby was his rollout of Logger II in 2021! Thousands of hours he has spent creating this county award tracking software with over 40,000 lines of code. Without this, we would be lost!

Don has helped each individual with their transition to the new program and is adding new features weekly.

Don's contributions are innumerable, and he is deserving of the 2022 SSB CHOTY Award.

Biography

I first got my ham license in Baltimore, MD in 1957 when I was 15. My best friend and I were in Scouts together, and we decided to learn Morse code and apply for our license. It was a tough choice, but we finally made it. I received the call KN3IMC. I lost the "N" when I passed the General test, but I have never really changed it. My interest in radio affected by whole like. Because of it, I took electrical engineering in college. My first job in 1964 was with the Boeing Co. in Philadelphia where they made helicopters. They put me in the Engineering Lab doing vibrating testing of rotating things. What that's got to do with electrical engineering, I never understood. After two years, I transferred in their analysis department evaluation tactical uses of helicopters. PC did not exist then, and computers were not generally not available then to lowly engineers, but I did do a lot of hand calculations in my work. I slowly moved into actual programming as computers became available. By the early 80s, I had moved to the Washington DC area and was working for a radar company. Stealth technology was just beginning, and they had to develop a new type of radar to measure the radar signature of "invisible" objects. I was their director of signal processing using Z80 microprocessors programming at the machine code level. I realized that radio hardware was not my interest, but boy could I write fast, useful code. I finally moved into advanced data acquisition and processing systems for a variety of customers, mostly working as a private consultant making more money and working less. Great when you enjoy what you are doing. I retired in 2006 and move to a small town in west central Georgia. Since retirement, I continued to program for funny (???) and no money. I built a MIS for my county's Archives where they store 15,000 linear boxes of records (school record, marriage and divorce record, court cases, etc.). I automated their inventory system allowing far quicker retrieval, as well as the checking out and in of documents.

Ham radio has been a major part of my life. I was not always active, and there were times when I did not have an active station. In the late 70s, I was active in the big winter contests, and built my own kw amplifier. I heard about county hunting at about

that time. I got a copy of the CQ Magazine logbook, but I was too busy with life to spend that much time chasing counties. However, by the late 80s my station was large enough and I had enough free time to get really involved. Did I get hooked! It took me 4 years to get my USA-CA award. It took me 10 years to get 2nd Time, and nine more years for the 3rd Time. I still have 205 counties to go for the 4th Time, but I am still trying.

When I began county hunting in earnest in 1990, the internet was just beginning. I felt that it was a perfect media to give MARAC a national presence, so I developed my CountyHunterWeb. I did it really to teach me how to write web-based applications, but it has turned into an integral part of county hunting community. It is hard to believe that this website has been in existence for more than 30 years. It has changed over time, but the Forum has continued to provide a meeting place to discuss issues of interest to all county hunters. The Needs Page is often the source data for helping lay out the route of a mobile trip.

Yes, I still enjoy classic county hunting, but I really enjoy going mobile. Almost from my first mobile contact in my driveway, my goal was to transmit from all the counties. I enjoy driving and visiting historical sites. Going mobile is a good excuse for going out driving. It took me 27 years to transmit from all the counties, and I was the 18th county hunter to do it. You would think when I got finished, I would not enjoy it as much. But the thrill of stopping on county lines in NM and CO is still there, and I can't wait till I can do it again.

At the National Convention in Kansas City (2019), I met the awards secretary, AB7RW, Phil. I appreciated his role in our club, but I could not believe the amount of work and time it took him to do his job. The biggest problem was the software he was using was not user friendly, prone to errors, and time consuming to use. Over the next year working with Phil, I completely rewrote the software. What used to require hours each week to accomplish can now be done in 10 minutes. Phil and I have a good working relationship, and I think MARAC is better because Phil can maintain the awards program in a timely manner. It is the glue that hold MARAC together.

Keeping track of the counties you have worked toward each of the many awards MARAC sponsors is a critical part of county hunting. As a programmer, I realized this fact, and built my own logging and MIS for my own use not long after I really started county hunting. Gene Olig, KD9ZP, took the lead in developing the MARAC Logger for general use. As such, it was the tool used by many county hunters because Logger meant you could easily keep track of your progress toward the many MARAC sponsored awards (there are more than 70 of them now) You had an incentive to keep in county hunting chasing the ever-increasing number of awards. There was always

another award just ahead to get you interested. I think Logger is critical to MARAC. Unfortunately, KD9ZP used VB6, a language which was obsolete almost before he started using it. I used VB6 myself but moved away from it by 2000. By 2020, it was no longer supported, and few had the development environment to write it. Also, after 20 years, errors had surfaced in Logger causing it to fail on many computers. K8EMS, who was one of the few who had both the development environment and the skills to dig into Logger, was taking on the task of maintain Logger. He realized that Logger had to be rewritten and had begun to rewrite it. He gave a presentation at the Michigan Mini in 2020, and I offered to help him. We both decided that it should be rewritten in VB.Net because it seemed to have a long future. Unfortunately, he had some health issues and had to stop his contribution to the rewrite. The task far exceeded my original concept. Because of significant differences in syntax between VB.Net and VB6, I had to begin from scratch. However, KD9ZP's basic algorisms were generally first rate, and saved me a lot of effort. The second half of 2020 was spent developing the draft of Logger 2. Beta testing of this draft begin in late October 2020. General release of Logger 2 was begun in March 2021. To date, Logger has been installed on more the 70 computers, and has generally received with good success. Of course, error have been discovered, with added capabilities as well. There has been a total of 84 separate releases. The latest release included the State Map capability to display the needs for all the needs by county in a state, as well as the routes of all spotted mobile stations operating in the state. With more than 40,000 lines of executable code, I expect that the development of new capabilities and the fixing of discovered errors will continue for some time into the future.


six trips with 96 last county notifications received. My LC total is now 1411, and more mobile trips scheduled for 2022.

Since 2017 I have resided in a HOA restricted condo which has curtailed a typical fixed station. Being a CW net control was always a joy for me, but it has proven difficult while operating remote stations.

The past seventy years in this hobby has been full of great memories for me, and I've found that county hunting holds the best of them.




I helped establish the Independent County Hunters Net in its early days and attended initial meetings for the beginnings of MARAC.







OPENING! SECRETARY FOR MARAC NEEDED

Our club has been fortunate to have Randy, K7TQ, serve as our Secretary for the last year. He has done an excellent and professional job for MARAC. He now has a need to step down, so we need someone to move in and fill his shoes. Training will be provided (3)

MARAC SECRETARY DUTIES:

- Is Elected by MARAC membership for a term of 2 years. Can volunteer to serve subsequent terms
- Notifies Board members of date, time, and location of upcoming Board of Director meetings, along with proposed Agenda
- Notifies MARAC webmaster prior to an official Board meeting so that notice can be created at least 7 days prior to a meeting
- Notifies Board members of date and time of conference calls needed for discussing club business
- Creates, from Board input, a meeting Agenda
- Attends and participates in Board conference calls and official BOD meetings. Votes on motions made. Conference calls are usually monthly, official Board meetings are roughly 4 per year.
- Takes the minutes during a Board of Directors Meeting
- After each meeting, distributes a draft of the minutes for Board members to review. A final
 copy of these minutes should be attached to the agenda of the next Board meeting so that
 they can be voted upon for final approval. These minutes are then sent to the MARAC
 webmaster for posting on the marac.org website
- Keeps a list of topics for Board discussion at each monthly conference call.
- Either runs each meeting, or assigns another Board member to run it for him/her.
- Gathers required reports from MARAC positions needed to create the Annual Report each July meeting. Distributes this annual report to the Board for approval. Then sends a copy to the webmaster for publishing on the MARAC website

MARAC General Counsel Opening

OPENING! GENERAL COUNSEL FOR MARAC NEEDED

MARAC GENERAL COUNSEL DUTIES:

The general counsel for MARAC is responsible for providing legal advice to the officers, directors and other officials of MARAC concerning the business and activities of the corporation.

This includes reviewing proposed contracts with the venue at which a MARAC meeting is to be held, as well as giving advice concerning communications received by MARAC relating to possible legal issues.
