### Important Dates Associated with the 2023 CHOTY Process:

• 2/1/2023 – Nomination period begins for both SSB and CW

- 2/1/2022 through 1/31/2023 12 month period of activity associated with nominations for 2023
- 3/15/2023 Nomination period ends at 11:59pm Pacific Daylight Time. (Nominations must be received by the Awards Manager by that time).
- 3/16 through 4/19/23 Awards Committee reviews nominations and determines up to three individuals who will appear as nominees for each category (SSB and CW) on the electronic ballot.
- 4/20/2023 Awards Manager forwards the list of nominees for each category along with supporting documentation (nomination justification and biographical information) to the Election Coordinator for publication in the May, 2023 issue of the RoadRunner.
- 5/1/2023 Nominee list and documentation appears in the May RoadRunner
- June 2023 Election Coordinator conducts election via electronic voting service to determine winners.
- July 2023 Winners announced during the Annual MARAC meeting

### Revised Award Rule for CHOTY Was Approved by the Board on January 23<sup>rd</sup>

The revised rule changes the process where all nominations will be forwarded by the original nominator to the Awards Manager instead of one of the District Directors. There will be no limit on how many nominees in any particular category can be submitted from any specific district. The Awards Committee will review the nominations and decide which nominees will appear on an electronic ballot as described in the rule in accordance with dates specified above.

# Reminder: March 15, 2023 is the deadline for submitting nominations for County Hunter of the Year – SSB and CW

A special article concerning changes to the County Hunter of the Year nomination process appeared in the February, 2023 edition of the newsletter. As explained in that article and the revised rule for CHOTY which was approved on January 23<sup>rd</sup>, all nominations from anyone are to be forwarded directly to the Awards Manager no later than 11:59pm Pacific Daylight Time on March 15, 2023. The specific individuals who have won either category (SSB or CW) in the last two years are ineligible to be nominated for the same category for 2023. Those individuals are listed in that article for your convenience.
